

of £5,000., defrayed from the funds of the nunnery. On the north side of the town is a fine gravelled walk, called the Mall, shaded by lofty trees, which forms a delightful promenade. The town, which is the property of the Earl of Clauricarde, who resides at Portunna, consists of several streets, many of the houses of which are neat and well built. The government of the town is vested in a seneschal, who holds a manorial court occasionally; and in a court-house, erected in 1821, general sessions are held twice a year, and petty sessions once a week. The other public secular buildings are a barrack, a bridewell, a linen-hall, and a workhouse. There are two branch banks, an extensive and long-established brewery, two tanneries, six corn

mills, and three hotels—the latter all situated in Main-street, which is the principal business thoroughfare. The parish church is a handsome edifice with a fine steeple, erected in 1821. The Roman Catholic chapel, lately rebuilt, is a noble and commodious structure, with a tower containing one large bell. The principal charitable institutions are a dispensary, and several schools for the education of the poor. A mechanics' institute, which has lately been established, is in a flourishing state. The market days are Thursday and Saturday—the former is the principal. Fairs, February 11th, May 25th, August 20th, and December 5th. The population of the parish, in 1841, was 7,152, and that of the town 5,458 inclusive.

MANOR-HAMILTON,

A MARKET and post town, partly in the parish of Killasnett, barony of Ross-Clogher, but chiefly in that of Clonclare, barony of Dromohaire, county of Leitrim, is 130 miles N.W. from Dublin, 28 N. from Carrick-on-Shannon, 25 N. from Leitrim, and 14 E. from Sligo; seated in a valley, surrounded by rocky mountains. The castle, now an interesting ruin, is situated on a gentle eminence near the town; it was the largest and strongest in the county, and was erected by Sir Frederick Hamilton immediately after the rebellion of 1641, when he received a grant of this manor, and hence the town derives its name. The castle is surrounded by a strong wall, defended by four bastions, one at each corner. The Earl of Leitrim, who is now the proprietor of the place, has built a spacious and handsome market-house, in the centre of the town, which consists chiefly of one long street. Barracks for constabulary and revenue police, a union poor-house, a dispensary, and a bridewell with court-house attached, are the other public establishments. In the last named building general sessions are held four times a year, and petty sessions once a fortnight. The usual retail trade of an inland town, including two good hotels, constitute the chief business of the place.

The places of worship are the church, a modern structure, with a handsome and lofty spire; a neat Roman Catholic chapel, and one each for Primitive and Wesleyan Methodists. The charitable institutions are the dispensary (before mentioned), supported by the grand jury grant and annual subscriptions; a free school of the Church Education Society, another supported by the interest of £900. left in perpetuity by Mr. James Masterson; an excellent national school; and a bequest of £10. yearly, left by Patrick Cullen, Esq. grandfather to the late Colonel Cullen, for the use of the poor of this parish. The market is held on Thursday; and the fairs January 12th, February 12th, March 12th, April 12th, May 8th, June 12th, July 1st, August 12th, September 12th, October 7th, November 12th, and December 12th. Population of the town 1,507.
