**MOHILL**

IS a small market and post town and parish, the lat-  
 ter partly in the barony and county of Longford, pro-  
 vince of Leinster, but chiefly in the barony of Mohill,  
 county of Leitrim, 95 miles n.w. from Dublin, 15 n.  
 from Longford, 11 e. by w. from Carrick-on-Shannon,  
 and the like distance s. from Ballinamore; pleasantly  
 situated on the sides of two gently-rising hills, in a  
 fruitful district. The town, which is the property of  
 Sir Morgan George Crofton, Bart. is composed of one  
 main street, from which several smaller ones diverge.  
 The principal trade of the place is in corn, provisions,  
 and yarn, with which it is supplied from the surround-  
 ing populous neighbourhood. The government of the  
 town is vested in the magistrates, who hold a petty  
 sessions once a fortnight in the sessions-house. Mohill

is a station for constabulary and revenue police, and  
 the residence of the sub-inspector of each. The public  
 buildings are a dispensary and fever hospital, supported  
 in the usual way, and a union workhouse. There are  
 also a loan fund and a news-room.

The places of worship are a church of the establish-  
 ment, a plain building, with a square tower, and a  
 spacious Roman Catholic chapel. There is a school  
 established here under the National Board of Educa-  
 tion. The market, a well supplied one, is held on  
 Thursday. There are no fewer than fifteen fairs held  
 in the course of the year, but of these only four are  
 chartered, viz., February 14th, April 28th, July 21st,  
 and December 4th. Mohill parish contained, in 1841,  
 17,918 inhabitants, and the town 1,626 of that number.

**NEWPORT,**

OR NEWPORT-PRATT, is a market and post town,  
 and sea-port, in the parish and barony of Burrishoole,  
 164 miles w. from Dublin, 11½ n.w. from Castlebar,  
 and 7 n. from Westport; situated at the extremity of  
 Clew Bay, on the north bank of Newport river, which,  
 together with that of the Burrishoole, also flowing  
 through the parish, abound with salmon. The first  
 named river is crossed by a good stone bridge, and there  
 are weirs constructed on both streams for the purposes  
 of the fishery, which is pursued here advantageously,  
 and the produce, after supplying the neighbourhood,  
 contributes largely to the Dublin and inland markets.  
 The exports consist chiefly of grain and oatmeal; for  
 the latter there is a considerable mill contiguous to  
 the town. The imports, since the removal of the cus-  
 tom-house to Westport, have become inconsiderable.  
 The channel here is deemed perfectly safe, being un-  
 obstructed by bars or sand-banks, and vessels of 250  
 tons burthen can come up to the quay. Sir Richard  
 Annesley O'Donnell, Bart. who is proprietor of the  
 town, has greatly improved it, as well as the land in the  
 neighbourhood, which naturally is remarkably produc-  
 tive. The same gentleman, in connexion with some  
 of the merchants here, erected the pier. In a small  
 court-house petty sessions are held every alternate

Tuesday, and a manor court on the first Wednesday in  
 each month.

The places of worship are a church of the establish-  
 ment and a Roman Catholic chapel. The church,  
 situated in the higher part of the town, is a modern  
 structure, the interior neatly fitted up and furnished  
 with a gallery, in which there is a small organ. The  
 charities of Newport comprise a dispensary, and paro-  
 chial, national, and infants' schools. To the support of  
 the first mentioned valuable institution, the benevolent  
 proprietor and patron of the town is a liberal contri-  
 butor. Newport House, the residence of this gentle-  
 man, is contiguous to the town. About a mile to the  
 south-east is Carrickaneady, one of the castles said to  
 have been built by the Burkes. About two miles from  
 the town is the extensive and beautiful ruin of Burrishoole  
 Abbey; and three miles distant, on the sea-shore,  
 is Rockfleec Castle, a small square fortress, said to have  
 been erected by Grana-Uile, better known as Grace  
 O'Malley, and celebrated for her maritime exploits.  
 The market, an exceedingly well-attended one, is held  
 on Tuesday. Fairs June 8th, August 1st, November  
 11th, and December 20th. The parish of Burrishoole  
 contained, in 1841, 11,942 inhabitants, and Newport  
 town 1,691 of that number.
