**STROKESTOWN,**

A MARKET and post town, in the parish of Banlin,  
barony and county of Roscommon, 91 miles w. n. w.  
from Dublin, 17 s. s. e. from Boyle, 15 w. by n. from  
Longford, 12 1/2 n. from Roscommon, and 6 s. s. e. from  
Elphin; situated on the main road from Dublin to  
Ballina. The town consists of two principal streets,  
intersecting each other at right angles; they are clean  
and spacious, and the houses for the most part are of a  
respectable class, and the entire have a cheerful ap-  
pearance. The business of the place is chiefly of a  
domestic and retail character, together with a corn  
trade of some little consequence—the lands round here  
being highly favourable for the production of grain.  
There are two principal inns, one in Bawn-street, the  
other in Bridge-street; the former, 'Hague's Hotel,'  
is a family, commercial, and posting establishment, ad-  
mirably conducted. The town is the property of Lord  
Hartland, whose mansion and domain, now the resi-  
dence of Major D. Mahon, are at the extremity of the  
main street. A court-house, with bridewell attached,  
a dispensary, and a constabulary barrack, are the public

establishments, exclusive of those for religious purposes.  
In the first mentioned building general sessions are  
held twice a year, and the resident magistrates, who  
assemble in petty session every alternate Thursday,  
regulate the municipal affairs of the town.

The church, a handsome stone building in the Gothic  
style, forms a regular octagon, and is ornamented with  
a tower and spire. The Roman Catholic chapel, a neat  
and commodious structure, is furnished with a belfry.  
There are a few pleasant seats of the gentry in the  
neighbourhood; among these may be mentioned 'Mount  
Browne,' the residence of George Browne, Esq.; 'Cloon-  
free,' George Knox, Esq. and 'Annfield Lodge,' W. B.  
Keon, Esq.; while the town possesses the handsome  
mansions of Thomas Conry, Esq. and Bartholomew  
Mahon, Esq. both ornamental to Bawn-street. A well  
attended market is held on Friday, and fairs May 18th,  
June 15th, October 19th, and November 16th. Besides  
these there is the fair of Ballinafad, held on the 27th  
August, and long celebrated as a large meeting for the  
sale of cattle. Population of the town, in 1841, 1,611.
