DONERAILE,

A MARKET and post town and parish (formerly a parliamentary borough), in the barony of Fermoy, county of Cork, is 140 miles s. w. by s. from Dublin, 26 n. by w. from Cork, 19 e. from Newmarket, 15 n.e. from Kanturk, 12½ s. w. from Mitchelstown, and 7 n. e. from Mallow; seated on the banks of the Aibeg, in the midst of a populous and romantic neighbourhood, the scenery of which has many attractions for the tourist. The river is crossed by a handsome stone bridge of three arches; besides this structure the town has little to boast in the way of architectural elegance: it consists chiefly of one wide street, and one or two smaller. The place is distinguished by no particular branch of business, and is without manufactures, unless two or three corn mills, in the vicinity, which furnish employment to a number of persons, may be taken as an exception. The government of the town is with the county and resident magistrates, who sit in petty sessions in the court-house occasionally. The inhabitants obtained the privilege of returning two members to the Irish parliament, from Charles II, and continued so to do until the legislative Union, when the borough was disfranchised.
