

DUNGARVAN

IS a market town, sea-port, parliamentary borough, and parish, in the barony of Decies-without-Drum, county of Waterford, 124 miles w.s.w. from Dublin and 24 s.e. from Youghal; seated on the bay of its name, on the road from Waterford to Cork, 28 miles s.w. from the former city and 53 r. by s. from the latter. This populous and well-built town is one of the most important fishing stations in Ireland, and supplies a very considerable district with fish. It is remarkable for being the place where the apple-potato was first produced in this country. Previous to 1815 this place was, perhaps, as uninviting in its aspect as it is now respectable in its general appearance—its conveniences were few, its trade unimportant, and the industrious classes languishing in inactivity. To the fostering hand of the Duke of Devonshire, the lord of the manor, the place may be said to owe its present importance in the scale of respectable towns. He erected a bridge and causeway across the Colligan, built a handsome street and square, constructed reservoirs for the supply of water, erected market places, contributed to the establishment of schools and medical charities, and gave encouragement and patronage to the revival of trade and the practices of industry. Almost the entire trade of Dungarvan is dependent on the exports and imports of the place, and on the interchange of agricultural produce and general merchandize in the markets. This town was incorporated about the year 1463; its privileges were renewed and its charter confirmed by James I. for the loyalty manifested by the inhabitants during the rebellion fomented in the reign of Queen Elizabeth. It is governed by a mayor, assisted by a bailiff. The quarter sessions of the peace for the western division of the county are held January 6th, April 8th, June 27th,

and October 24th; there is also a manor court held by the seneschal every three weeks, which has cognizance of debts not exceeding £15. Dungarvan sends one member to the Imperial parliament, in the person of Richard Lalor Shiel, Esq. of Long Orchard, Templemore, county Dublin. The returning officer is the sheriff of the county. Dungarvan is the head quarters of a constabulary district, comprising six stations: it is likewise a coast guard station.

The parish church of Saint Mary is a neat structure, but has little else to recommend it to notice than its situation, which is truly beautiful, commanding, as it does, a wide and uninterrupted view of the bay and harbour. In the Roman Catholic divisions, the parish is divided into West and East Dungarvan; in the former is the new chapel, dedicated to the Assumption, an elegant and spacious structure, in the later English style of architecture, with an elaborately grand altar. In the east division there are two chapels, one at Abbey side, the other at Ballinroad. In Church-street, a community of nuns of the Presentation order is established; the members kindly impart instruction to more than four hundred females; and, in Devonshire-street, is a community of the Christian Brothers, by whom six hundred boys are educated. On the 'Abbey side' of the river are the remains of an ancient and lofty square castle, of which nothing more is known than that it was formerly the property of the Magraths. Market days Wednesday and Saturday. Fairs the second Wednesday in every month principally for pigs, January 9th, February 7th and 14th, March 13th, April 10th, June 11th, July 10th, August 14th, September 11th, October 9th, and November 8th. The population of the parish, in 1841, was 13,321, and the town 8,625 of that number.

POST OFFICE, Church street, Benjamin Green Dyer, *Post Master*.—Letters from DUBLIN and the NORTH OF IRELAND, also from ENGLAND, arrive (from WATERFORD), likewise from CORK and the SOUTH and SOUTH-WEST OF IRELAND (from YOUGHAL), every day at twelve, and are despatched at the same hour.—A foot post from ARDMORE arrives every forenoon at eleven, and is despatched every day at half-past twelve.
