

COOTEHILL.

A MARKET town, in the parish of Drumgool, barony of Tuilaghurvey, county of Cavan, is 66 miles N.W. from Dublin, 15 s. from Monaghan, the like distance N.E. from Cavan, 12 S.E. from Clones, 10 S.W. by s. from Ballybay, and 9 S.W. from Shirock; pleasantly situated on the Cootehill river, and on the road from Dublin to Clones and Kingscourt. The town, which is comparatively well built, consists of four spacious streets, and the country around is very beautiful, embellished within a radius of three miles with many fine seats and elegant mansions. Mayo hill, the highest summit of the district, situated in the direction of Shirock, commands an expansive view; and the banks of the river, for several miles above the town, furnish a constant series of very rich and picturesque landscapes. The linen branch prevails in the district, but not so extensively as formerly, and in the town are established branches of two proprietary banks, and a savings' bank. The principal hotel here, the 'Bellamont Arms,' is a very well conducted house. Lead ore and slate abound in the neighbourhood, but have been only partially worked. General sessions of the peace are held at Easter and in the month of October, and petty sessions every Saturday.

day; they are held in a neat court-house, at the back of which is a secure bridewell.

There are no fewer than eight places of worship in Cootehill, namely—the parish church, two Presbyterian meeting-houses, a handsome Roman Catholic chapel, a meeting-house for the Society of Friends, two Methodist chapels, and one Moravian. The church, situated at the lower extremity of the town, fronting to the main street, is a large and handsome structure, in the Elizabethan or Tudor style of architecture, with a tower surmounted by a spire. The charities comprise a fever hospital, a dispensary, a union workhouse, and a school under the National Board of Education. Contiguous to the town is Bellamont forest, the fine demesne of Richard Coote, Esq. containing upwards of a thousand acres, nearly one-half being occupied with thriving woods, and ornamented with several pleasing lakes: it also includes a spa, and an eminence called Diamond hill, from which latter, and some other elevations, very beautiful views are commanded. The markets are Friday and Saturday, the former for general produce, the latter for grain. Drumgool parish contained, in 1811, 12,575 inhabitants, and Cootehill 2,425 of that number.
