NEWTOWN-LIMAVADY,

OR NEWTOWN-LIMAVADY, is a market town (formerly a parliamentary borough), in the parish of Drumashose, barony of Kenaght, county of Londonderry, 144 and 166 miles respectively by different routes, N. by w. from Dublin, 72 N.W. from Belfast, 22 N.W. by N. from Maghera, 16 E.N.E. from Londonderry, 14 W.S.W. from Coleraine, and 9 N. from Dungiven; seated on the right bank of the Roe, about four miles south-south-east from the mouth of that river, and about two miles and a-half from the south-eastern extremity of Lough Foyle. Its situation is very beautiful—being the rich vale of the Roe, surrounded by elegant seats embosomed in woods and overlooked by eminences whose summits command views of surpassing interest. Mr. Fraser says—'We recommend the traveller who is interested in the topography of this part of the country and the adjacent coast, to ascend Benyevenagh, whose verdant summit is 1260 feet above the sea: from it, and even from many of the less prominent parts of its beautiful cherty sides, under favourable circumstances, with the map, he will learn more of this mountain district and its shores, from Fair-head to Innishoven-head, than from the most minute and lengthened description.' The district in which the town stands was anciently the territory of the O'Caahans or O'Caues, the head of a powerful and warlike sept, whose castle, on the brow of a romantic glen, was called *Lima-vaddy*, or the Dog's Leap; and the town took its name from the circumstance of its modern erection, while, to distinguish it from several others, it acquired the adjunct *Lima-vady*, by its contiguity to O'Caahans' castle. The town comprises four principal and several small streets; three of the main streets are spacious and well built. At the bottom of Catherine-street are two extensive market places, one the property of Mr. John Hunter, for butter, pork, and various commodities—the other for grain only. In the Main street is the old market

house, the upper part of which is occasionally used as a ball room and for public meetings. The linen trade of Newtown, at one time of considerable extent, is much diminished in importance; and the business is now of a general and local nature. The Roe-mill distillery is an extensive and noted establishment; and there are two proprietary banking houses, a savings' bank, and an excellent hotel and posting-house—the Queen's Arms. The river is crossed by a good stone bridge of six arches, from which there is a fine view of Roe Park, the seat of Sir Edmund M'Naghten—a very richly-wooded demesne, and a great ornament to the environs of the town. A charter from James I. erected Newtown into a borough, and appointed its corporation to consist of a provost, twelve free burgesses, and a commonalty. The corporation ceased to perform any municipal act about the year 1808, and it has since become entirely extinct. The borough, which returned two members to the Irish Parliament by right of its charter, was disfranchised by the Union. A court of general sessions is held twice a year; petty sessions every alternate Tuesday; and the public peace is preserved by the county constabulary.

The parish church of Drumashose is a large and handsome edifice erected in 1750, on the site of a former one, and enlarged in 1825 by the addition of an aisle. The Roman Catholic chapel is now a neat structure, having been lately thoroughly repaired and improved from the designs and under the superintendence of Mr. Given, architect and builder. There are places of worship for Presbyterians (four meeting houses), and for Independents, Wesleyan Methodists and Covenanters a chapel each. A dispensary, a union poor-house, a clothing charity, and schools for the gratuitous education of children of both sexes, are the benevolent institutions. The population of the town, as taken in 1841, was 3,101.
