BIRR OR PARSONSTOWN,

A handsome market and post town and a parish, spectator places himself for observation, is moved by in the barony of Ballybrit, King's county, is 80 miles south-west from Dublin, 24 north-east from Nenagh, the like distance south-west from Tullamore, 12½ north from Roscrea, 11 south-west from Frankford, and 7½ south-east from Banagher. This, the most considerable town in King's county, is situated on the river Birr, and adorned with a fine castle, built by the family of the Parsons; now the residence of the Earl of Rosse. This castle was besieged by General Sarsfield, and relieved by Kirk. The demesne connected with the mansion is liberally open to the public, affording a charming promenade; the river flows through it, and is crossed by a wire suspension bridge. The centre of the mansion was destroyed by fire in 1832, and was re-built with great improvement. His lordship possesses some valuable MSS., being journals of the civil wars from 1641 to 1688; and T. C. Cooke, Esq., has many ancient war-like weapons in his custody; this gentleman has written a history of Parsonstown. As Parsonstown has acquired distinguished celebrity from the scientific achievement of its noble townsmen, the Earl of Rosse, it will be proper to give a brief detail of the progress and completion of what is not inaptly termed the 'monster telescope.' Those who are desirous of more ample particulars are referred to the skilful descriptive work published by Messrs. Sheilds and Son, of this town, from which we derive the chief portion of this narrative. On entering his lordship's beautiful demesne two castellated stone walls will be noticed, upwards of fifty feet high, between which reclines this Leviathan of optical instruments; and near it is seen a second of one-half its dimensions, environed by ingenious machinery. This latter was first constructed; the speculum of which is three feet in diameter; while that of the larger is six feet. The tube is fifty-six feet long, including the speculum box, and its diameter seven feet; it is made of deal, hooped with iron. It is fixed to main work in the ground by an universal hinge, which allows it to turn in all directions. The yards between which it turns are twenty-four feet apart, and seventy-two feet long, lying exactly in the meridian line; and the celestial objects are one hour in passing over the space between the two walls. The machinery by which the telescope is raised, depressed, or turned laterally, is beautifully simple, and efficient; and the gallery upon which the
