KINNEGAD

It is a small town and parish, in the barony of Farbill,
county of Westmeath, 38 miles W. from Dublin, 19 W.
from Kilkenny, 18 S.W. from Trim, and 11 S.E. from
Mullingar; situated at the point where the Connaght
road forks into the two ways branching respectively
toward Galway, Mayo, Roscommon, Leitrim and Sligo.
The town is composed of one street, the houses of
which are not in a very good state of repair, and its
trade is merely the supply of the neighbourhood by the
shops. The parish church is a plain stone structure,
with a spire, having a burying-ground attached. The

Catholic chapel, situated in an enclosure on one side of
the town, is a neat and commodious building. A dis-
pensary, supported by subscription, and a school, in
connection with the Wesleyan Methodists, are the
principal institutions. Towards the support of the school
the late Lady Lanesborough bequeathed £20. per year,
with a house and an acre of land, and the Wesleyan
connexion contribute £10. per annum. The market,
entitled to be held on Wednesday, has fallen to decay.
Fairs February 9th, May 9th, July 22nd, and October
9th. Population 715.

COACHES AND CARS.
Passing through Kinnegad.

To DUBLIN, the *Royal Mail*, every night
at a quarter before one—a *Coach* (from
Galway), every afternoon at a quarter
past two—one (from Boyle), at half-past
two—and a *Car* (from Mullingar) at the
same hour; all go through Clonard,
Kilcock, Maynooth and Leixlip.

To BOYLE, a *Coach* (from Dublin) every
forenoon at half-past eleven; goes
through Mullingar, Edgeworthstown,
Longford, Drogheda and Carrick-on-
Shannon.

To GALWAY, the *Royal Mail*, every
night at a quarter past twelve; goes
through Tyrone's Pass, Killebeggan, Ath-
lone, Ballinacree and Loughrea—and a
Coach, every forenoon at a quarter past
eleven; goes the same route.

To MULLINGAR, a *Car* (from Dublin),
every evening at half-past five.

To SLIGO, the *Royal Mail*, every night
at a quarter past twelve; goes through
Mullingar, Edgeworthstown, Longford,
Drogheda, Carrick-on-Shannon, Boyle,
Colbourn and Ballinacree.

LEIGHLIN BRIDGE, BAGNALSTOWN AND ROYAL OAK.

LEIGHLIN BRIDGE is a small town, partly in the
parish of Augha, and partly in that of Wells, barony of
East Idroge, county of Carlow, 7½ miles south from
Carlow, and was formerly a place of some importance,
but it has gradually declined to a mere village, the ex-
tinction of a distillery and of several breweries having
contributed to its decay. The navigable river Barrow
flows past it, and gives facility to the transport of butter
to Wexford, in which article there is a good trade. A
stone bridge crosses the river, and at the foot of it are
the fragments of a once considerable castle, which was
dismantled by Cromwell. The country around is very
pleasing, fertile, and well cultivated.

The parish church occupies a lofty site, and its tower
is a conspicuous object to a great distance. There are
two Catholic chapels, a community of Carmelite friars,
two national schools, and one for infants. About a mile
from the town is a medicinal spa. Fairs are held May
14th, Easter Monday, September 25th, and December
18th. Population 1,748.

BAGNALSTOWN, or *Bagonalstown*, is a neat post
town, in the parish of Dunleckny, county of Carlow,
situated about two miles south from Leighlin Bridge,
on the river Barrow, and has been increasing in popu-
lation and improving in trade for several years past,
and it is now a place of considerable business, both in
shop trade, and that in corn and flour, several large
mills being within it and in the neighbourhood. The
working of stone, from the adjacent quarries, employs
