**MOUNTRATH**

As a market and post town, in the parish of Clonagh, barony of Maryborough West, Queen's county, 60 miles s.w. from Dublin, 61 n.e. from Limerick, 28 n.w. from Kilkenny, and 8 s.w. from Maryborough; eligibly situated for the purpose of a good inland trade, being, as is seen, equi-distant between Dublin and Limerick. Within the last thirty or forty years the town has been much improved in its appearance: a new church has been built, and a new street formed. The manufacture of some worsted stuffs furnishes employment to several of the industrious poor, and in a cotton factory others find scope for their industry; but this trade has considerably fallen away. The 'Coach Hotel' here is a remarkably well regulated house. Petty sessions are held every Thursday.

The places of worship are the parish church, a handsome structure, with a tower and clock, surmounted by a spire; a neat Catholic chapel, and meeting houses

for the Society of Friends and Methodists. A monastery of the order of St. Patrick was founded here in 1815, and a convent of that of St. Bridget, by the late Dr. Delany, in 1814. There are several public schools; one supported by the munificence of Sir Charles Coote, one upon the national plan, and others for instructing the children of the poor at the convent and the monastery before mentioned. Ballyfinn House, the seat of Sir Charles Henry Coote, Bart, the proprietor of the town, is a most sumptuous residence, and contains a fine collection of paintings and sculpture. The pavement of the great hall, which is very beautiful, was brought from Rome, and much of the furniture was made for George IV. and purchased by Sir Charles. The market is held on Saturday. Fairs January 6th, February 17th, March 24th, May 8th, August 11th, September 29th, and November 6th. The population of Mountrath town, in 1841, was 3,000.
