## PORTARLINGTON.

mentioned. Previously the estates of Portarlington were granted by Queen Elizabeth to Lord Cromwell, his successor, for his conduct in the rebellion of 1641, was attainted of treason, and forfeited all his lands, which were bestowed on Sir Henry Bennet, one of the ministers of Charles II, who was created Lord Arlington. The estates became forfeited again in the rebellion of 1688, and in 1696 King William granted the lands to his Dutch followers, and his favourite, Lord Galway, who made leases of the town and estates for ever to a number of French Protestants, who came over to him. He also erected two churches, one for the French and the other for the English settlers; and these are still continued, and endowed with lands. He assigned funds for an English and a French school, which were the means of establishing in Portarlington those eminent seminaries, which have produced some of the most shining characters in the kingdom—among these the Duke of Wellington and his brother, the Marquess of Wellesley, who received their early education here. The civil and municipal affairs of the borough are transacted under the jurisdiction of the magistrates, who hold their meetings in the court-house every Wednesday; and manorial courts leet and one of record are likewise held here. The borough returns one member to the imperial parliament: the town, in 1821, was 3,106.

## RATHANGAN

IS a small market town and parish, the latter partly in the iron of East Ophaly, but chiefly in that of West Ophaly, county of Kildare, 33 miles s.w. from Dublin, 10 s.e. from Edenderry, and 6 n. by w. from Kildare; situated on the eastern bank of the Grand Canal, and near the verge of the counties of Kildare and King's. The town, which is the property of the Lake of Leinster, is tolerably well built, and is the residence, with the neighbourhood, of several respectable families. The place, however, enjoys but little trade, notwithstanding its eligibility of situation for that purpose. The magistrates, in whom the government of the town is vested, hold a petty session every Monday, and a stipendiary magistrate is here resident.

The parish church, which is finely situated on an eminence, is rather a handsome building of stone, with a tower. The other places of worship are a beautiful Roman Catholic chapel and meeting-houses for the Methodists and the Society of Friends. The charitable institutions are a dispensary for the sick poor and schools, under the national board, for children of either sex, with another supported by Viscount Harberton. The market, a well-supplied one, is held on Monday. Fairs, June 26th, August 26th, and November 12th. The town, which is entirely in the barony of East Ophaly, contained, in 1811, 1,010 inhabitants.
