and market town, sea-port, and borough, partly in the parish of Bathnew, barony of Newcastle, but chiefly in that of Kilpoole, barony of Arklow, 31 miles s. by E. from Dublin, 15 N. from Arklow, and 10 N. E. from Bathdram; situated upon the estuary of the river Vartrey, which forms the harbour on the eastern side of its romantic county. The ancient name was Wykingto or Wykinglogh, derived from its situation at the southern extremity of a narrow creek shat out from the sea by a long peninsula called the Murragh. It is supposed to have been one of the maritime stations possessed by the Daues, before the landing of the English, in 1169, and to have been called by them Wigginge Lough, signifying the Lake of Ships.' Two or three traginents of a castle remain upon a rock, rising perpendicularity from the sea. This castle is said to have been built by Maurice Figzmaurice, at the time of Strongbow's invastor of Iteland. The town comprises several spacious streets, a quay skirting the harbour, and the suburb Murrough, or Marragh before named, which is connected with the town by two bridges across the river. Upon this subdrb are the London and Dublin Bauks, and a noble building, in the centre of the race-course, Upon this suburb are the London and Dublin Banks, and a noble building, in the centre of the race-course, in which is transacted the business of an extensive loan fund society. This establishment acts in a double capacity—granting loans to a large amount in sums from £1. to £10., and receiving deposits also, upon the system of a savings' bank. Within the same building is the industrial school noticed hereafter. The other public structures, exclusive of those for religious service, are the court-house, the gaol, infirmary, market-house, and barrack.
