The tax is levied at the rate of sixpence in the pound, sterling, on the value of all houses and lands within said limits, for carrying the purposes of said act into effect, by annual valuation and applotment by two sworn applotters appointed by the commissioners. Eighteen commissioners compose the board, twelve of whom are chosen on the first Tuesday in September in every year, by the majority of the ratepayers. Any five commissioners constitute a board for transacting business. Qualification of a commissioner, if resident within the town—occupation of a house worth £20 per annum; if not resident, an annual property of at least £70, arising out of the town. The tax cannot exceed sixpence in the pound, so long as the Barony of Rathdown house tax shall continue to be levied.
