CHARLEVILLE,

tant 112 miles south west of Dublin, 30 north of Cork, 20 couth of Limerick, 14 north of Mallow, and 58 north east of Killarney, by Macroom. It is pleasantly situated on the confines of the county of Cork, and owes its establishment to Roger, first Earl of Orrery, and Lord President of Munster, who held his court here, and bestowed on its improvement a portion of that munificence, for which the noble family of Boyle has been eminently distinguished.
