ENNIS,

in the province of Munster, is one hundred and twelve miles south-west of Dublin, twenty north-west of Limerick, and thirty two south-by-east of Galway. It is a very considerable, but irregularly built town, situated on the river Fergus, and carrying on an exsituated on the river Fergus, and carrying on an ex-tensive inland trade; the markets are excellent, and the town is well furnished with good shops for the supply of the adjacent country, as well as the in-habitants, who are very numerous and highly respec-table.
