NENAGH

Is a market, post, and fair town in the county of Queen Elizabeth granted a determinable lease of its Tipperary, 75 miles south-west of Dublin, 19 north-estates to Robert Collum for a trifling annual rent. east of Limerick, and on the mail road between them. It is a considerable place upon a river, which flows into Lough Derg, and was formerly defended by a strong castle, called Nenagh Round, the ruins of which are still in existence on one side of Castie-street. In the year 1200, an hospital for canous, observing the rule of St. Augustive, was founded here, and dedicated the rule of St. Augustine, was founded here, and dedicated to St. John the Baptist. It was to be constantly open to the sick and infirm. Theobald Walter, the first Butler in Ireland, liberally endowed this hospital. first Butler in Ireland, liberally endowed this hospital. Queen Elizabeth granted all its possessions to Oliver Grace for ever, for a trifling annual rent by homage and fealty. In the reign of Henry III. a Franciscan friary was founded by the Butler family, and considerable grants were made to it by Lord Thomas de Cantwell. In the year 1550, O'Carroll destroyed both the town and friary, but the garrison preserved the castle. The public buildings are not remarkable; the church is a neat modern structure, and there are a court house, and barracks for infantry. Out of the precincts of the town on the Dublin road is an excellent spring of water, over which is engraved the following inscription in lime-stone.

Of the English Nation TO THE POOR OF IRELAND, AT A SEASON OF EXTREME DISTRESS.
