NOTE OF THE POPULATION OF THE DUNGIVEN

Is a small market town, in the county of Derry, of a venerable old mansion, formerly the residence of 112 miles north north west of Dublin by the nearest road, and 143 miles by the post road, seven north by west of Newtownlimavady, 10 north west of Maghera, and 15 east of Londonderry. This town is surrounded by high mountains, where are found considerable quantities of white mountain apparent. considerable quantities of white mountain crystals. An extensive bleach green, belonging to Michael King, esq. gives employment to many of the inhabitants. At the upper end of the town on the Maghera road stands the church, a stone building in the form of a cross, of which the Rev. Alexander Ross, of Banagher, is rector; a little farther in the same direction is the Catholic chapel, and near the church are the ruins

Colonel Keary, proprietor of Dungiven. About a quarter of a mile from the town is an old burying ground, where lie the ashes of the ancient family of Quentin & Kane, who was one of the Irish chieftains before the time of Cromwell; seven of his sons were interred in the same tomb. The market day is Saturday, and fairs are held on the Tuesday before old Christmas, the Tuesday before old Candlemas, the Tuesday before old Patrickmas, May the 25th, the Tuesday before old Midsummer, the Tuesday before old Lammas, the Tuesday before old Ladyday, October 25th, and the last Tuesday in November. The population is about 600.

ENNISKILLEN,

HE county and assize town of Fermanagh, is 79 miles marth-west of Deblin, 23 south-east of Bally-shannon, 20 east of Manor-Hamilton, and 30 east of Manor-Hamilton, and four town snannon, 27 east or manor-trainition, and 50 east of Sligo. It is a borough, market, post and fair town, and sends one member to parliament, in the person of Lord Corry of Castlecoll, son to the Earl of Belmore; the two representatives for the county are Captain M'Ginniss and Goneral Archdail. The river Erne completely encircles the town, so that it may be considered an istual. At the east entrance, upon a fine eminence, stands the county infirmary, a large and Handsome building under the superintendence of Charles Wenden, surgeon and M. D.; opposite to this is the standard and a surgeon building this is the county gapt, a spacious and secure building, finished about six years ago; and not far distant, is a fine stone bridge. When this bridge has undergone an enlargement of 12 feet in width, which is in great progress, and the houses, which encumber it on war, but used at present as a military hospital. In 384

each side, are taken down, this much frequented thoroughfare will be rendered much more convenient and ornamental. In the centre of the town is the market house, a spacious building with a large ball room over it; a steeple was added to it in the year 1792, under the direction of the Rev. Dr. Smyth, provost, and Mr. Robert Hassard, burgess. Enniskillen is governed by a provost and 14 burgesses, who are annually elected; the present provost is Captaia William Gabbet, who is also chief magistrate of the town. A little below the market house is the parish church, a very ancient structure with a tower and one bell; this building was finished in the year 1637, as appears from a stone tablet in front of the steeple. At the western extremity of the town are the barracks with suitable accomodations for five companies of foot, with another barrack for artillery, in time of

this direction is another bridge with eight arches, much too narrow, for the number of constant passenmuch too narrow, for the number of constant passengers. The shambles, which are built of brick and well slated, are neat and convenient. Near the town, beautifully situated on a rising ground, is Enniskillen school, supported by a grant of King Charles I.; the income of land, belonging to this establishment, is near 3,000%, per anuum, and the school-house is a spacious building, capable of accomodating 70 boarders. The present master is the Box Andrew O'Rairo. The present master is the Rev. Andrew O'Beirne, L. L. D., whose salary is 500 pounds a year with 33 acres of land; 250 pounds are paid to the first

assistant, 150 to the second, and 100 to the third; the present number of boarders is about 22, with about 20 day scholars: the terms for boarders are 36 guineas per annum, and 6 guineas entrance. Here are also a free school, under the management of the London Hibernian Society; and Sunday schools be-longing to the established church. The Catholics, Methodists and Presbyterians have heir various places of worship. The market-day is Thursday, and there are 13 fairs in the year: viz. on the 19th of every month, and the 26th of October. The population is about 8000.
