suffered considerably in the rebellion of 1641. It was a borough previous to the union, and sent two members to the Irish parliament. It is governed by a seneschal in the person of Mr. Robert Kennedy, who holds manor courts every three weeks. Sir Hans Sloane, the celebrated naturalist and physician, was born here on the 16th of April, 1660. There is an extensive cotton manufactory now building, which will add naterially to the trading consequence of the town. The marker-day is Friday, but it is not now attended. Fairs are held on the 10th of April, Trinity Monday, 10th of October, and 11th of December.
