## STRANORLAR,

# TANDERAGEE,

IN the county of Armagh, sixty miles north-by-west of Dublin, eleven north-by-west of Newry, nine west of a romantic and finely wooded demesne, and was

by north of Armagh, seven and a half south-by-west built many years ago on the site of an old castle, forby north of Armagh, seven and a half south-by-west of Lurgan, and four south-by-east of Poctadown, is situated on a hill, and commands an extensive view of the sarrounding country, which is remarkable for the beauty or its rural scenery. The church, a handsome Gothic structure, was re-built in 1812, and Miss Sparrow, now Lady Mandeville, greatly contributed towards completing it. Near the church is the mansion of Lord Mandeville, 5th of July and the 5th of November.

### WARRENPOINT,

IN the county of Down, is a small, but rapidly at that time only one house and a large rabbit warren, improving town, pleasantly situated at the distance from which the town derives its name. The quay is of five miles south-east of Newry, and two from very convenient and capable of receiving vessels of Rosstrevor. This place and its immediate neighbourhood contain a large number of comfortable jodging houses for the accommodation of visitors, het and cold baths, and an excellent inn; its vicinity also abounds with most delightful scenery. On passing through the town toward the shore, the prospect becomes extremely beautiful and grand; the bay of Carlingford expanding to the view, and forming a noble basin, where a thousand ships may ride in perfect safety, is bounded on the right and left by lofty mountains; at the extremity of the property the

from which the town derives its name. 'Fhe quay is very convenient and capable of receiving vessels of very convenient and capable or receiving vessels or large burden. A newly erected church adds, much to the beauty of the place, which discontinue fresbytterian meeting house, a Catholic chapel, a dispensary, and a savings' bank. In the vicinity of the town there is a neat row of houses, called Seaview, over the beauty and adapted for the accommodation of both. extremely well adapted for the accommodation of bathers; the prospect from which is very fine, commanding a view of the whole bay, of the quay of Rosstrevor, and the adjoining wood, together with the entire vale diversified with beautiful plantations, magnificent seats, and elegant cottages. There are five annual fairs viz: the 17th of Jerus Land and the land annual mountains; at the extremity of the prospect the lighthouse and blockhouse, and the vessels passing the bar present to the eye a very pleasing sight. Sixty years ago this place was scarcely known, there being with beautiful plantations, magnificent scats, and elegant cottages.
