BALLINROBE

Is a neat market town and parish, in the barony of Kilmaine, county of Mayo, 147 miles w. of Dublin, 38 s. of Ballina, 26 s. e. of Newport, and 19 s. e. of Westport; pleasantly situated upon a considerable eminence, commanding extensive views of a delightful and richly varied country. Ballinrobe possesses great claims to antiquity, and was formerly considered of much more importance than it now is. An Augustinian friary was founded here in the early part of the fourteenth century, and is mentioned in the registry of the Dominican friary of Athenry, under the name of the *Monastery de Roba*. The barracks (once the residence of Lord Tyravly) stand unequalled for their beautiful, healthy, convenient and romantic situation on the banks of the

Robe, from which river the town derives its name. The market and court-house is a plain stone building, in which are held general and petty sessions—the latter every Monday. A bridewell and a union workhouse are the other public buildings, besides the places of worship.

The church is a plain neat edifice, situated on the south side of Market-street. The Roman Catholic chapel, which stands a short distance from the town, on the road to Castlebar, is well and substantially built. The market, held on Monday, is generally well attended. Fairs, Whit-Monday and December 5th. The parish of Ballinrobe contained, in 1841, 11,150 inhabitants, and the town 2,678 of that number.

BALLYMOTE

Is a market town, in the parish of Emlaghfad, barony of Corran, county of Sligo, 120 miles n.w. from Dublin, 14 s. from Sligo, and 12 s. w. from Boyle; pleasantly situated in the midst of a fruitful neighbourhood. It carries on a small inland trade; a considerable quantity of oatmeal is manufactured at the mills of Mr. Gorman, and there are some very respectable retail establishments, together with an excellent hotel, conducted by Mr. Irwin, as a commercial and posting-house. The magistrates, who hold a petty sessions once a month and quarter sessions, have the government of the municipal affairs of the town. The public buildings comprise a court-house, with a bridewell attached; barracks of the constabulary and revenue police, and a dispensary.

The places of worship are a beautiful parish church, recently built, with a noble spire; a Roman Catholic chapel, and a Wesleyan Methodist chapel. Adjoining

the town is Earlsfield, the beautiful seat of R. Gethin, Esq. and about half a mile distant is Newbrook, the residence of the Rev. John Garrett, rector of Emlaghfad. Here are the ruins of a monastery of Franciscan friars, supposed to have been founded in the thirteenth century; the interior is now used as a burying ground, and the site of the Catholic parish chapel is also within the ancient precincts. Not far distant are the neglected remains of a large castle, built in the year 1300, by Richard de Burgh, second Earl of Ulster, whose possessions and power in the kingdom were then unequalled. The castle was large and strong, and, with that of Sligo, being in the hands of the Irish, impeded greatly the reduction of this province. The market is on Friday; and the fairs, January 26th, Easter Monday, May 11th, June 14th, September 3rd, first Monday in November, old style, and Monday before Christmas day. Population of the town, 839.
