CASTLE-BLAKENEY,

A SMALL post town and parish, the latter called  
 also *Gallagh or Killosohan*, in the barony of Kilconnell,  
 but chiefly in that of Tyaquin, county Galway, is 109  
 miles w. from Dublin, 31 E.N.E. from Galway, and 16½  
 N.E. from Athery, situated on the road from Bal-  
 linasloe to Tuam. The town, if town it can be called,  
 is irregularly built, and enjoys no trade but that which  
 is confined to the reciprocal requirements of the small  
 population. The parish church is rather a handsome  
 building. A constabulary police station is established

 poor, of both sexes, in the parish are aided by annual  
 donations from the Archbishop of Tuam, from Lord  
 Clonbrock, Lord French, and some other benevolent  
 persons. A small market is held on Monday. Fairs,  
 January 2nd, March 17th, Tuesday in Witsun-week,  
 July 26th, and October 2nd. The parish of Killosohan,  
 or Gallagh, contained, in 1841, 4,496 inhabitants,  
 of which number only 233 were returned for the village  
 of Castle-Blakeney.

CASTLEREA,

A MARKET and post town, in the parish of Kilkee-  
 van, barony of Ballintober, county of Roscommon, 112  
 miles w. by N. from Dublin, and between seventeen  
 and eighteen miles from the town of Roscommon,  
 Boyle, and Strokestown; pleasantly situated on the  
 river Suck. The town, which consists chiefly of one  
 long street, extending from the market-place in a di-  
 rection east and west, contains some well-built houses  
 and respectably furnished shops. The place is deemed  
 remarkably healthy, has the advantage of excellent  
 water springs, and the dwellings being, for the most  
 part, whitewashed, the town altogether exhibits a clean  
 and lively aspect. An extensive distillery, producing  
 annually upwards of twenty-five thousand gallons of  
 whisky, two corn mills, and a tobacco manufactory,  
 are the principal branches—besides which, the hotel in  
 the market-square, may be alluded to, as an admirably  
 conducted house for commercial gentlemen and post-  
 ing. The public buildings, exclusive of those for divine  
 worship, are a court-house, with bridewell attached,  
 constabulary and revenue barracks, a dispensary, and  
 several schools. The court-house being in a state of  
 dilapidation, a new one is about to be erected, for which  
 purpose a considerable sum has been already appro-  
 priated. General sessions for the division are held here  
 twice annually, and petty sessions every Wednesday.  
 A constabulary force is stationed in the town.

The places of worship, are the parish church, a neat  
 structure, with a square embattled tower; the Roman  
 Catholic chapel, a spacious slated building, and a Wes-  
 leyian Methodist chapel. There are schools for children  
 of both sexes and for infants, supported solely by the  
 munificence of Lord Mount Sandford, and ably super-  
 intended by the Rev. John L. Chute, the worthy curate  
 of the parish. Six other schools within a short  
 distance of the town, are, in like manner, main-  
 tained by the same noble benefactor; there is also a  
 national school. The town is the property of the no-  
 bleman above named. His seat, 'Mount Radford,' is  
 very beautiful; the park, a delightfully wooded spot,  
 is cheerfully irrigated and intersected by a small river,  
 which falls into the Suck a little below the town. There  
 are several other fine seats and residences ornamental  
 to the neighbourhood of Castlereas, amongst these may  
 be mentioned 'Clonalis,' the seat of the O'Connor  
 Don, M.P.; 'Dealfield,' that of Captain Gray; and the  
 'Hill,' the Rev. J. L. Chute, &c. Dr. Young, Bishop  
 of Clonfert, an eminent natural philosopher and ma-  
 thematician, was a native of this town. The market  
 days are Wednesday and Saturday, the former chiefly  
 for butter and oats; the latter for cattle and provisions.  
 Fairs May 23rd, June 21st, August 23rd, and Nov. 7th.  
 The parish of Kilkeevan contained, in 1841, 10,922 inha-  
 bitants, and the town of Castlereas 1,233 of that number.
