## GORT

Is a market town, partly in the parishes of Kiltartan and Beagh, but chiefly in that of Kilmacdaugh, barony of Kiltartan, county of Galway, 125 miles w. by s. from Dublin, 22 s.e. from Galway, 19 n. from Ennis, and 15 s.w. from Loughrea; pleasantly situated on a gentle acclivity rising from the branch of a river, on the road from Galway to Ennis, and on the main line between the provinces of Connaught and Munster. The town consists of three principal streets, wide and clean, which radiate from a spacious square, where the market is held: the houses, which are chiefly of stone, are well built, and the place has altogether an air of comfort and respectability. Lord Viscount Gort is proprietor of the town, and takes his title from it. This nobleman's seat, Loughcoter Castle, situated about three miles distance, is a noble castellated building, in a well-planted demesne, and commanding very fine lake, woodland, and mountain views. In front of the castle is Loughcoter, a delightful expanse of water, three miles long, abounding in fish, and enlivened by several verdant-clad, well-wooded islands. The public buildings of the town comprise the court-house, a convenient building, erected in the square in 1815; a bridewell, built in 1814; constabulary and military barracks, and a union workhouse. The Dublin Banking

Company have a branch establishment here, and the Phoenix Fire Assurance Company an agency. A temperance reading-room and a billiard-room, both in the Market-square, may be mentioned as places of relaxation—the latter is well conducted and respectfully attended, as is 'Glyn's Hotel,' which is also a posting-house. General sessions are held twice a year, and petty sessions weekly, in the court-house. A manorial court for the recovery of small debts is also held occasionally. A chief constabulary police station is established here, and it is the residence of a sub-inspector. The parish church of Kilmacdaugh was erected in 1810, on land given by the first Lord Gort. It is an elegant cruciform structure, with a conical spire; the fittings of the interior, which were renewed in 1828, are handsome and well kept. The Roman Catholic chapel is also a cruciform building, and likewise indebted for its site to Lord Gort. The scenery in the vicinity of this town is very beautiful, comprising on the west the Burren mountains, county of Clare; and on the east the eminences of Derrybrien, Castle-Daly, and Roxborough. The market is held on Saturday; and the fairs, March 17th, May 10th, August 11th, and November 7th. The population of the town, as returned in 1841, was 3,056.
