### SWINEFORD,

**OR SWINFORD**, is a market and post town, in the parish of Kileconduff, barony of Gallen, and county of Mayo, 140 miles N. W. of Dublin, 19 N. E. of Castlebar, 17 N. of Clare, and 15 S. S. E. of Ballina; seated on elevated ground, and derives its name from a fordable stream, which passes by the town, and near which was formerly held a considerable market for swine. The place enjoys, at the present day, little importance from its trading transactions, and none from its architectural embellishments. The principal business establishment is that of Messrs. Mulligan & Co. drapers and merchants. The court-house is a good and convenient building lately erected; therein general sessions are held in April and October, and petty sessions every Tuesday.

### TUAM,

**A MARKET**, post, and corporate town (formerly a parliamentary borough) the seat of an arch-diocese, is partly in the parish of Dunmore, but chiefly in that of Clare, county of Galway, 125 miles W. by N. from Dublin, 33 S. E. from Castlebar, the like distance N. W. from Ballinasloe, and 20 N. by E. from Galway; situated in a low and flat but salubrious part of the country. Towards the end of the fifth century an abbey was founded here, dedicated to the Virgin Mary, which, in the beginning of the sixth, was made a cathedral by St. Jarlath. A city was afterwards built here in honour of this exemplary bishop, whose remains were deposited in a chapel called *Teampal-na-Serina*, or the 'Church of the Shrine.' After his death we find express mention made of three persons who were abbots of Tuam, viz. Cellach, son of Eochad, who died in the year 808; Nnadet-Hua-Bolchain, abbot and anchorite, who died October 3rd, 877; and Conach, son of Kieran, abbot of Tuam and prior of Clonfert, who died in 879. The priory of Saint

John the Baptist was founded about the year 1140, by Tirdelave O'Connor, King of Ireland. It is not certain to what order this house belonged, but it was granted to Richard Clanricarde. The abbey of the Holy Trinity was founded either in the reign of King John, or in that of Henry III for Premonstratensian canons. Tuam, with all its churches, was destroyed by fire in 1244. Previous to the restoration Tuam was a considerable garrison town; it is now a constabulary station, and the residence of a sub-inspector. The government of the town is vested in a sovereign and twelve burgesses. There are consistorial and metropolitan courts, and the general sessions of the peace are held twice a year, and petty sessions every Wednesday. The court-house is a neat well-arranged building, and there is a small convenient bridewell contiguous to it. The trade of Tuam is principally for the supply of the surrounding districts. The well-established brewery of Mr. Blake is extensive, and there are two principal inns—one of which, Daly's

Hotel, in Vicar-street, is a most respectable house in its conveniences for families or commercial gentlemen, besides being a posting establishment.

The cathedral, a venerable pile, is a mixture of the Saxon and Gothic styles of architecture, in which the former predominates. Its exterior, besides other embellishments, is adorned with a perfect and highly ornamented Saxon arch, which is considered a rare and valuable relic of antiquity. The interior is very well kept, and adorned with beautiful windows, all of stained glass. The bishop is the Hon. and Right Rev. Thomas Plunkett, D.D. His palace is a handsome edifice, surrounded by a beautiful and finely wooded demesne. The Roman Catholic cathedral is a fine cruciform edifice in the later English style, with a tower of great altitude, and six turrets at the angles of the building, terminating in minarets richly crocketed. The interior corresponds with the beauty of the exterior; the altar is of diversified marble, and the eastern window is richly stained; some of the decorations were brought from Rome. On the whole it is, perhaps, the most sumptuous ecclesiastical structure the Roman Catholics possess in the country, and has cost £18,000. The present archbishop is the Most Rev. Dr. M'Hale, in whose patronage is the Roman Catholic College, or seminary, of St. Jarlath, which is well provided with professors in the different branches of literature. A community of Presentation nuns, and also of Franciscan monks, have establishments here. A dispensary, which annually affords relief to 5,000 applicants, was founded here in 1813, by Lord Decies Beresford, and is now supported by subscriptions and donations. There are also three free schools for the education of poor children, namely, a Protestant school, supported by the bishop, boys' Catholic school, taught by the friars of the monastery, and one for girls, who are instructed by the ladies of the Presentation Convent. In the centre of the town stands the market-house, a plain, square, stone building, over which is established a reading-room, supported by subscription. The market is held on Saturday; and the fairs, May 10th, July 5th, October 20th, and December 15th. The entire parish of Tuam contained, in 1841, 13,425 inhabitants, and the town 3,601 of that number.
