WESTPORT,

AN important and thriving sea-port and market town, in the parish of Oughaval, county of Mayo, 156 miles w. from Dublin, 28 s. by w. from Ballina, 10 s.w. from Castlebar, and about 7 s. from Newport; situated at the south-eastern extremity of Clew bay, and at the mouth of a small river, which falls into that part of it forming the harbour of Westport—a name derived from its situation on the western coast. The town, which is of modern date, consists of three principal streets and a Mall of large and handsome houses, on both sides of the river, the banks of which are
