Waterford. Five hundred boys receive, gratuitously, herein a religious, literary, and scientific education, and a certain number of the deserving are clothed, and have trades and situations provided for them. The site for this valuable institution was the gift of Terence Doyle, Esq. father of James Doyle, Esq. of this town. The guardians are the Right Rev. John Power, Roman Catholic bishop of Waterford and Lismore, and the Very Rev. John McKenna, D. D. and P. P.; and the director and superintendent is Mr. John P. Corbett. With the Presentation convent a school is connected, wherein between two and three hundred poor girls are educated by the praiseworthy application of the ladies of the establishment. A lying-in and fever hospitals are the other principal charitable institutions. There are some few remains of the old tower walls, and an ancient building called the Castle. Carrick confers the title of Earl upon a branch of the Butler family. The markets are held on Wednesday and Saturday. The chartered fairs are Tuesday in Whitsun-week, August 15th, and October 15th. There are also fairs established by custom, and December 5th. Population, see Carrick-on-Suir.

WITH CARRICK-BEG AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

CARRICK-ON-SUIR is a market and post town and parish, in the barony of 11fa and Offa, county of Tipperary, about 100 miles s. w. by s. from Dublin, 13 E. from Clonmel, 17 n. w. from Waterford, and 63 s. e. from Limerick; situated on the main road between the two last-named cities, on the north bank of the Suir, from which the adjunctive name of the place is derived, and which river here forms a boundary between the counties of Tipperary and Waterford. An ancient stone bridge is the medium of communication with the suburb of CARRICK-BEG, on the opposite side of the river, in the county of Waterford. In 1670 the great Duke of Ormonde established the woollen manufacture here, which flourished until the close of the last century, but has since declined, and at the present day but very little is done in this branch. The principal trade now is in corn, butter, and provisions—the former is very extensive, and the trade in timber, slates and coal, is also considerable. Upwards of £7,000. have been expended in the improvement of the navigation of the river, and vessels of two hundred tons burthen can now come up to the quay. The facility thus obtained of exporting the produce of the surrounding district has had a most beneficial effect upon the general trade

of the place, which is still increasing; and the spirit of improvement in the town has kept pace with its commercial prosperity. A new and handsome court-house has been erected, adjoining the bridewell, on the Fair-green; a new town-hall in Union-street, and a commodious workhouse on the Clonmel road. A branch of the Tipperary Joint Stock Bank, and of the National Bank of Ireland, are established here. General quarter sessions are held for the district, and petty sessions every fortnight. A constabulary police force, stationed in the town, have a convenient barrack in New-street, and there is also a barrack for infantry. A mechanics' institute, with which a news and reading room and library is connected, are well supported.

The parish church of St. Nicholas is a plain, neat structure; but the Roman Catholic chapel is spacious, and its interior handsomely fitted up. A monastery of the order of the Christian Brotherhood, and a convent of the sisters of the order of Presentation, are established here. The school premises of the former is a very handsome building, in a delightful situation. The establishment is a branch of Mr. Edward Rice's foundation, of Waterford, erected in 1805, at the sole expense of Mr. Thomas O'Brien, wine merchant, of
