KENMARE

IS a small post town and parish, in the barony of Glenarought, county of Kerry, 209 miles s.w. from Dublin, 39 s.e. from Dingle, 40 s. by e. from Tralee, 35 s. by w. from Listowel, 29 w. from Macroom, and 20 s. by w. from Killarney; seated beneath, and nearly surrounded by the romantic mountains of Kerry, and washed by a broad estuary of the Roughty, or head of Kenmare bay, which opens to the Atlantic ocean. The river, which is capable of admitting ships of almost any tonnage to within a short distance of the town, is crossed by a handsome suspension bridge, erected at the joint expense of the Marquess of Lansdowne and the Commissioners of the Board of Works, at a cost of about £8,000; it was commenced in 1838, and is the first structure of its kind in Ireland. A newly published work, speaking of Kenmare, observes:—"The new road from Glengriff to Killarney at once exhibits so very masterly and stupendous a specimen of modern engineering, offers so desirable a route to the grand natural picture-gallery of Kerry, and commands such superb and sublime views, in both its southern and its northern divisions, that it can hardly fail to render Kenmare a thoroughfare of exactly the description which stimulates the prosperity of a small town." There is no particular or prominent trade attached to Kenmare; its business is local and domestic, assisted by the visitors in the bathing season, who are attracted by the romantic scenery and fine salmon fishing in the Blackwater, which flows into

Kenmare bay, about six miles below the town. General sessions of the peace are held in June and December, petty sessions the first Monday in every fortnight, and a manorial court, under the Marquess of Lansdowne, for the recovery of debts not exceeding £10. is held by the seneschal every three weeks. The bridewell is a substantial building of stone, and its construction applicable to the classification of prisoners. The parish church is a modern structure, with a steeple—the interior convenient and well kept. It is situated about half a mile east of the town, on a gentle eminence, at the termination of a fine avenue of trees, and commands an extensive view of the Kenmare estuary and the surrounding scenery. The Roman Catholic chapel is a large and substantial building, lately improved by means of a munificent contribution from the Marquess of Lansdowne. The charitable institutions comprise a dispensary and fever ward, and a school under the National Board of Education. To the westward of the town are the ruins of Dunkerron and Capanacoss Castles—the former was built by Owen O'Sullivan, and the latter was formerly the residence of O'Sullivan More. The market, chartered for Saturday, has fallen into disuse. Fairs, February 27th, April 15th, May 20th, July 1st, August 15th, September 26th, November 20th, and December 15th. Population of the parish, in 1811, 5,339, inclusive of 1,339 inhabitants of the town.
