

LISMORE AND CAPPOQUIN.

LISMORE is a market town (formerly a parliamentary borough), the seat of a diocese, in the parish of Lismore and Mocollop, partly in the barony of Condons and Clangibbons, county of Cork, but chiefly in that of Coshmore and Coshbride, county of Waterford, 140 miles s.w. from Dublin, 43 w.s.w. from Waterford, 15 w. by n. from Dungarvan, and between five and six n. by e. from Tallow; romantically situated on the summit of a steep hill, rising from the southern bank of the Blackwater, over which is a fine bridge of stone, erected by the Duke of Devonshire, at an expense exceeding £9,000. The scenery in this neighbourhood is considered equal in beauty to any in the kingdom. The banks of the river, from Fermoy to Youghal, present a succession of picturesque objects, and the country is studded with tasteful seats of the landed proprietors. The castle, supposed to have been erected by King John, is boldly situated on the verge of a rock, rising perpendicularly from the Blackwater; over the gates are sculptured the arms of the first Earl of Cork; opposite the entrance is constructed a modern portico of Bath stone in the Doric order, designed by Inigo Jones; the several offices, which compose the two sides of the square, are still kept in repair. The manor of Lismore or Lismore Castle was granted by Myler Magrath, Archbishop of Cashel, and Bishop of Lismore, to Sir Walter Raleigh, at whose death it was forfeited, and purchased by Sir Richard Boyle, who highly embellished the original edifice by many considerable additions and improvements, all of which suffered in the rebellion of 1641. In 1785, the Duke of Rutland, then Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, in the course of a tour through Munster, held a council in the castle, and issued proclamations from it: it is also celebrated as the birth-place of Boyle, the philosopher, and, it is said, of Congreve, the poet. This magnificent pile, so long neglected, underwent a complete repair through the munificent liberality of its present noble proprietor, the Duke of Devonshire. It was an episcopal residence for a considerable period; but in the year 1363, the bishoprick of Lismore was united to the see of Waterford, seven hundred and thirty years after its foundation. The trade of Lismore is very inconsiderable, but on the Blackwater below the castle is a salmon fishery of some consequence, and the river affords facility of commerce with the port of Youghal. The government of the town is confided to the county and resident magistrates, who hold petty sessions every alternate Wednesday in the court-house, a tolerably spacious building, and general sessions of the peace are held in April, July, October, and December. The corporation, which received its charter from Charles I, returned two members to the Irish parliament prior to the Union, when the borough was disfranchised, and the corporation ceased to exercise its municipal functions.

The See of Lismore was united to that of Waterford during the prelate of Bishop Reve, in 1358, and both

were annexed to the archiepiscopal see of Cashel by the Church Temporalities Act, passed in the 4th year of William IV. The Cathedral of Saint Carthagh (now used as the parish church) is a handsome structure, in the later English style, with a square tower, surmounted by a light and elegant spire, which were added a few years since, when other considerable improvements were made: from the elevation of the church the spire is a conspicuous and pleasing object at a great distance round. The windows of the choir are of stained glass, and the bishop's throne and prebendal stalls are of oak, elaborately carved. The Roman Catholic chapel is a commodious edifice in Chapel-lane; and that for Presbyterians, in Main-street, is a neat one. A convent of the Presentation has lately been established here; the premises erected on a beautiful site given by the Duke of Devonshire; and the establishment has been liberally endowed by the Right Rev. Dr. Foran, r. c. b. of Waterford and Lismore; by the Very Rev. Dr. Fogarty, r. p. of Lismore, together with contributions from the neighbouring gentry. A handsome residence for the respected Catholic pastor has been munificently erected at the expense of the duke, adjoining the chapel. The ladies of the Presentation convent laudably and gratuitously instruct a considerable number of female children in a school connected with this establishment. There are no stated market days, but on Saturdays the general marketable commodities are brought to the town in larger quantities than on the other days of the week. Fairs May 25th, September 25th, and November 12th. The parish of Lismore and Mocollop contained, in 1841, 21,552 inhabitants, including 3,007 returned for Lismore town.

CAPPOQUIN is a small market town, in the barony of Coshmore, and parish of Lismore, four miles east from that town, pleasantly situated on the northern bank of the Blackwater, and on the mail coach road from Waterford, through Youghal, to Cork. The river is navigable from hence to Youghal harbour, and a steam vessel plys daily between the two places. This communication also facilitates the exportation of corn, a trade of some consequence to the town and district. Powers' Hotel is a convenient and well-conducted establishment, and from the proprietor every information may be obtained, relating to the arrival and departure of the mails, steam-boats, cars, &c. The places of worship are a neat chapel of ease to Lismore, and a spacious one for Roman Catholics. The surrounding country is finely diversified, abounds with highly picturesque scenery, and the roads in almost every direction towards the neighbouring counties are good. Near the town is the seat of Sir Richard Keane, Bart. a handsome mansion, seated in a well-planted demesne, commanding a fine view of Dromana and the river. Market days, Wednesday and Saturday. Fairs March 17th, May 31st, July 5th, September 20th, and October 14th. The population, in 1841, was 2,341.
