MILLSTREET,

A SMALL market town, in the parish of Drishane,
 barony of West Muskerry, county of Cork, is 196 miles
 s. w. from Dublin, 37 w. n. w. from Cork, 22 e. from
 Killybeg, 18 w. s. w. from Mallow, 13 n. w. from Mac-
 room, and 11 s. w. by s. from Kanturk; situated on the
 main line of thoroughfare between the counties of
 Cork and Kerry, upon an eminence commanding an
 extensive prospect of the surrounding country, which
 is luxuriant and pleasantly varied. In consequence of
 the gradual decline of the linen manufacture, and the
 falling off of a market town, this place has descended from its
 grade of a market town to little better than an incon-
 siderable village. Captain Wallis, of Drishane Castle,

is lord of the manor. The magistrates meet in petty
 sessions every Friday at the court-house, a small struc-
 ture, underneath which is the bridewell. The coal
 mines wrought in the neighbourhood find occupation
 for numbers of the industrious class. The places of
 worship are the parish church, a rather handsome
 structure, and a very neat Roman Catholic chapel. The
 charities consist of a dispensary, a convent school for
 girls, and a national school for boys. There is a patent
 for a market to be held on Friday, but none has been
 for some time kept. Fairs, March 1st and 13th, June
 1st and 13th, September 1st and 13th, and December
 1st and 13th. Population, in 1841, 2,162.

MILLTOWN,

A SMALL market town, in the parish of Killeoman,
 barony of Trughenackmy, county of Kerry, about 260
 miles s.w. by s. from Dublin, and between 17 : 18
 s. from Tralee, is situated on the main road fi- the
 latter town to Cahereiveen, and on the banks of the
 Maingee. The river, which flows into the harbour of
 Castlemain, is navigable for vessels of one hundred
 tons to within about a mile of the town. The place
 enjoys but little trade, is irregularly built, and exhibits
 but little to prepossess the stranger in its favour. The
 only structure of elegance it can boast is Killeoman

Abbey, the seat of Sir William Duncan Godfrey, Bart.
 The church is rather a neat edifice, with a square tower;
 and the Roman Catholic chapel is a handsome and spa-
 cious one, with an ornamental bellry of stone. There
 is a place of worship for Methodists. A free school for
 children of both sexes and a dispensary comprise the
 charities. The market, entitled to be held on Satur-
 day, is not maintained. Fairs, April 26th, June 23rd,
 August 23rd, and December 15th. The population of
 Killeoman parish, in 1845, was 4,745, including 797
 inhabitants of Milltown.
