firm; this establishment was liberally endowed by Theobald Walter, the first of the Butlers in Ireland. In the year 1550, the friary and the town were destroyed by O'Carroll, but the castle was preserved by the garrison. The friary lands, once so rich, were transferred by lease to Robert Cullum for a trifling rent, by Queen Elizabeth. The town consists of four streets crossing each other, the market-place forming a centre. It is supplied with water from wells; and on the Dublin road is an excellent spring of water, enclosed by masonry, bearing this inscription:—"Erected by voluntary subscription, to commemorate the benevolence of the English nation to the poor of Ireland, at a season of extreme distress, A.
