NEWCASTLE

IS a market town, in the parishes of Newcastle and Monegay, barony of Glenquin, county of Limerick, 145 miles s. w. from Dublin, 51 s. w. from Cork, 39 s.e. from Tralee, 25 s.w. from Limerick, 19 n.w. by w. from Charleville, and 7½ s. w. from Rathkeale ; pleasantly seated close to the river Darra, on the road from the Kerry coast to Limerick. It was anciently called Castle-roe, and owed both its origin and its name to the knights templars, who erected a castle here in 1184, around which, in process of time, a town was formed and fortified, the inhabitants of which ultimately obtained a charter of incorporation. The town comprises four principal streets : all a square ; in the latter are the church and an infantry barrack. At one time a considerable business was done here in leather, and tanning was carried on extensively ; but this has fallen away, and no particular branch or manufacture distinguishes the place as one of commerce : its chief trade is now confined to the shops, which are supported by the reciprocal demands of the inhabitants and the custom of an opulent gentry in the neighbourhood. Courts leet and baron are held by the seneschal of the manor, and petty sessions for the district by the magistrates—Monegay contained, in 1841, 10,557 inhabitants, and the town of Newcastle 2,917 of that number.
