

TALLOW,

**OR TALLAGH**, is a neat and respectable little market town in the parish of its name, barony of Coshmore and Coshbride, on the confines of the counties of Cork and Waterford; 28 miles S. E. from the former named city, 50 W. S. W. from the latter, and 4 S. S. W. from Lismore; pleasantly situated near the banks of the river Bride, on the mail road between the cities before mentioned. It was erected into a borough by James I. and endowed with many privileges through the influence of the first Earl of Cork; and previous to the union it returned two members to parliament, when it was disfranchised, but long before that event the corporation had ceased to exercise any municipal functions, and the government of the town may now be said to be vested in the resident and county magistracy. The senechal of the manor for some time continued to hold a court with jurisdiction to the extent of £15., but this likewise has ceased, and the only pleas now entertained in the manor court are under 40s. The wool-combing business was formerly carried on extensively, but the trade in grain is now the staple, and employs a considerable capital. The brewing and malting establishment belonging to Mr. Anthony here is an extensive concern. The principal inn is O'Brien's, a very well conducted commercial house. The National Bank of Ireland has a branch in operation here. The places of worship are the parish church of St. Catherine, a venerable structure, and a Roman Catholic chapel, both spacious and commodious buildings. A national school and a fever hospital are the principal charities of the town. To the west of the bridge that crosses the Bride are the ruins of Lisfinny Castle, formerly the property of the Earl of Desmond. The scenery around is considered remarkably fine, and the neighbourhood highly eligible as a place of residence. The market, a well supplied one, is held on Thursday, and the fairs March 1st, June 10th, August 8th and December 8th, principally for cattle. The parish of Tallow contained, in 1841, 4,867 inhabitants, and the town 2,967 of that number.

TARBERT,

A SMALL market town in the parish of Kilaughten, barony of Inaghicconnor, county of Kerry, is 157 miles S. W. from Dublin, 63 S. S. W. from Cork, and 32 S. S. E. from Tralee; situated at the north-western verge of the county, on the southern bank of the lower Shannon, about thirty-five miles below Limerick. Opposite to the town is a small island on the Shannon, which has a commodious road and harbour, where vessels either bound for Limerick, or to sea, may find a safe shelter from tempestuous weather. On the island are a tower and battery, to which is attached an establishment of engineers. Tarbert being the landing place for passengers from Dublin and Limerick to Tralee and the Lakes of Killarney, and being situated on the high road from Limerick to the latter places, it enjoys some advantages from the visit of tourists and travellers, independent of which it is a place of but moderate trade. A variety of articles are imported from Limerick for

the inhabitants of the town and neighbourhood, and corn, butter, pigs, and other agricultural produce are exported to that city. A revenue station under the board of customs, and one of the constabulary police are stationed here; and petty sessions for the district are held by the magistrates on alternate Tuesdays.

The parish church is a neat modern structure about a quarter of a mile east of the town. The Roman Catholic chapel is a handsome cruciform building, lately erected at the cost of £1,200. The Wesleyans have also a chapel. The chartered school here was liberally endowed by the late Dr. Leslie, bishop of Limerick; there is also a school under the national board of education. The town has the benefit of a dispensary, well supported and skillfully superintended. The market is on Thursday. Fairs, Jan. 1, Easter Mon. June 22nd, August 12th and Dec. 11th. Population of Kilaughten parish 5,102, inclusive of 1,024 inhabitants of the town.
