AUGHNACLOY,

WITH BALLYGAWLEY AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

AUGHNACLOY is a flourishing little market town, in the parish of Carrentel, barony of Duncannon, county of Tyrone, 89 miles N. N. W. from Dublin, 19 S. E. from Omagh, 16 N. W. from Armagh, 11 S. W. from Duncannon, and 10 E. from Clogher; pleasantly situated on the left bank of the Blackwater, two miles and a half below the point where that river begins to divide the county of Tyrone from that of Monaghan, and on the mail road from Dublin to Londonderry. The town consists of one long street, and several diverging subordinate streets and lanes; its appearance is pleasant, clean, and neat, indicative of the comfort and respectability of its inhabitants. Its general and domestic trade is good, and, at the markets and fairs, a very considerable amount of business is transacted. A constabulary police station has been established here; and petty sessions are held every alternate Monday.

The parish church, which was erected by Acheson Moore, Esq. who also commenced building the town, is a spacious and handsome structure, with a spire, containing a good clock: it is situated nearly in the centre of the town, and almost opposite to it is the market-house, a very convenient building. The other

places of worship are a Roman Catholic chapel, a large one for Presbyterians, one for Independents, and two for Wesleyan Methodists. Two miles west of the town, on the road to Clogher, are the ruins of Garvey House and Lismore Fort—the latter erected in 1619 by Sir Thomas Ridgway; and at Garvey, one mile distant, is a valuable mineral spring. The market, which is remarkably well attended, is on Wednesday, and the fairs equally important, are held on the first Wednesday monthly. The population of the town at the last general census was 1,841.

BALLYGAWLEY is a small market-town in the parish of Errigal-Keerogue, barony of Clogher, in the same county as Aughnacloy, between three and four miles N. N. W. from that town. It is an improving and prosperous little place: the neighbourhood is interested in the linen manufacture, and in the town is a distillery and brewery, a large establishment belonging to Mr. Armstrong. A new church and a Presbyterian chapel are the places of worship, and a dispensary the principal charitable institution. Fairs June 5th, September 2nd, and November 2nd, for cattle, sheep, and pigs. The population, in 1841, was, 881.
