

BALLIEBOROUGH.

OR MOYNOLLOUGH (formerly the name of the parish) is a market town and a parish, partly in the barony of Lower Kells, county of Meath, province of Leinster, partly in that of Castlerahan, but chiefly in Clonke barony, county of Cavan, about 54 miles N.W. from Dublin, 74 N.E. from Virginia, 14 N.W. by N. from Kells, and 12½ S. from Cootehill; situated in a valley on the road between the two last named towns. It consists of one principal street and two diverging lanes. There is no particular branch of trade flourishing here, the business enjoyed being of a general and local nature, carried on by the shopkeepers. General sessions of the peace for the Hilary and Midsummer periods are held, and a manorial court annually. The court-house, a convenient building, was enlarged and improved in 1834, and the bridewell was built in the same year. Stations of the coast-guard and revenue police have been established in the town.

The church, a handsome structure, with a square tower, was erected in 1838. The other places of worship are a Roman Catholic chapel, a neat building, and one each for Wesleyan Methodists and Presbyterians; the latter situated a mile and a half from the town. The charities of Ballieborough comprise a dispensary, erected by private subscription, and opened in 1836; a fever hospital in 1839, and the union workhouse, erected in 1844. About one mile to the north of the town is Ballieborough Castle, the seat of Sir William Young, Bart. It is situated in a fine demesne, and occupies the site of an ancient fortress or castle, which had two flanking towers, and remained standing till a few years since, when it was pulled down to make room for additions and improvements in the present house. The market is held on Monday. Fairs February 17th, May 17th, June 15th, August 17th, October 14th, and November 17th. The population of the parish, by the returns made in 1841, was 6,984, including 1,203 inhabitants of the town.

BALLYBAY.

A MARKET town and parish, partly in the barony of Monaghan, but chiefly in that of Crenorne, county of Monaghan, is 64 miles N.W. from Dublin, 15 E. from Clones, 12½ N. from Carrickmacross, 8 S. from Monaghan, the like distance N.E. from Cootehill, and about six W. from Castleblayney; situated at the intersection of the roads from the last named town to Cootehill and Clones, and from Carrickmacross to Monaghan. Its site is somewhat singular, being that of an irregular hill, nearly insulated (bay like) by two lakes and the same number of rivers, and from this circumstance of situation it is said to derive its name. Not long since the town was noted for being a seat of the linen manufacture, which here has sustained a serious declension. The flax market, however, is still justly celebrated both for the quantity and quality of the article, and is not excelled, perhaps, by any other mart in the kingdom. About four miles from the town is the mountain of Bunnahin na, at the base of which are bleach greens and mills. Extensive tracts of bog supply the various works throughout the neighbourhood, and the inhabitants of the town with abundance of fuel. In the centre of the town, which is of respectable appearance, stands the market and court house, wherein petty sessions are

held by the local magistracy, at irregular periods, and town meetings conducted, and other public business transacted.

The church is a neat structure, erected in a commanding situation, and presents a conspicuous object on approaching the town. There is a place of worship for Presbyterians, and a public school for children of both sexes and any creed. About half a mile from the town is Ballybay House, a handsome and spacious mansion, beautifully situated on the border of a large lake, backed by extensive and ornamental plantations. The scenery around the town and the approach to it is extremely beautiful and picturesque, studded with lakes and boldly diversified with hills and dales. From one point are seen, to the east, at the distance of twenty miles, the deep blue and lofty mountains of Slieve-Gullion; and, from the same spot, the village may be perceived beneath reposing amidst hills on the margin of a pellucid lake. The market, which is a considerable one for flax and butter, besides the usual provisions, is held on Saturday; and there is an extensive fair for horses and cattle on the third Saturday in every month. The parish contained, in 1841, 6,468 inhabitants, and the town 1,768 of that number.
