To BALLYMONEY, by the Car to Cole-
rairie; and also by the Coach to Lon-
donderry.
To BELFAST, the first Royal Mail from
the Adair Arms Hotel, every morning
at three—and the second Royal Mail,
every afternoon at half-past two—the
Perseverance, from Kennedy's, Bridge
street, every morning at six—the Fair
Trader, every Monday, Wednesday and
Friday afternoon at half-past two—and
a Van, every morning at four; all go
through Antrim.

BALLYMONEY,

A MARKET town and parish, partly in the liberties
of Coleraine, county of Londonderry, and partly in the
barony of Kilconway, but chiefly in that of Upper Dun-
luc, county of Antrim, 150 miles N. by W. from Dublin,
49 S.W. from Belfast, 28 N. by W. from Randalstown,
17 S.W. from Ballymena, and 9 S.E. from Coleraine;
seated on a small tributary water of the Bann, about
three miles from its confluence with that river. The
town is irregularly built, and lies scattered over an area
extending from Milltown, on the Rathsharkin road, to
Rawdon foot. It is the capital of the two baronies of
Dunluc, and the largest seat of their population and
trade; the latter being by no means extensive. The
linen manufacture prevails in the neighbourhood, and
the goods produced are brought to Ballymoney markets,
which, however, are more noted for agricultural pro-
duce; grain, butter, and pork, being abundantly sup-
plied. The district which forms the immediate environs
of the town is naturally rich, and has been much im-
proved by culture. A branch of the Belfast Bank, and
of the Ulster Bank, are established here. General
sessions of the peace are held alternately with Bally-
mena; petty sessions once a fortnight, and a manorial

court, for the barony of Dunluc, on the first Friday
in every month. The court-house, a convenient build-
ing, wherein the courts are held, is situated in the cen-
tre of the town, and the bridewell, recently built, is
attached to it.

The church, a large plain edifice, with a tower and
cupola, was erected in 1782, near the site of an ancient
church, of which some fragments still remain. The
other places of worship are for Roman Catholics, Pres-
byterians, Unitarians, and Covenanters. The trustees
of Erasmus Smith's fund established a school in 1813;
there is also one under the National Board of Educa-
tion, and J. Leslie, Esq. and two or three other bene-
volent landholders, support schools for the poor on
their respective estates. The other charitable institu-
tions are a dispensary and a union workhouse. Conti-
guous to the town, on the west, is Leslie Hill, the fine
seat of James Leslie, Esq. A linen market is held on
the first and third Thursday in each month, and a weekly
market for the usual domestic commodities on Thurs-
day. Fairs May 5th, July 10th, and October 6th. The
entire parish of Ballymoney contained, in 1841, 11,727
inhabitants, and the town 2,490 of that number.
