**CARRICKMACROSS,**

**A** MARKET, fair, and post town, in the parish of Magheross, barony of Farney, county of Monaghan, 51 miles N.W. by N. from Dublin, 25½ S.E. by S. from Monaghan, 10 S. from Castleblayney, and 21 S.W. from Newry; situated on the mill road from Dublin to Londonderry. It derives its name from its situation on a rock (*Carrick*), and from one of its early proprietors, *Kess*, a celebrated Irish chieftain. It was formerly a town of note, and in the reign of Queen Elizabeth had a castle, which was the residence of the Earl of Essex, to whom the queen granted the barony of Farney. The eastern part of this barony now belongs to the Marquess of Bath, and the western to E. J. Shirley, Esq., M.P., of Lough Fea Castle, in this county. The castle, together with the ancient church, was burnt during the disturbed period of 1641. It was then occupied by William Barton, Esq., who was the lessee of the whole of the Earl of Essex's property, and represented the county of Monaghan; while he was attending his parliamentary duties, his wife and children resided in the castle, and fell victims to the flames. The town consists of one wide principal street, with several lanes diverging; the houses in the main street are uniformly built; but the market house, which stands in the centre obstructs the view. It was built from the ruins of the old castle, part of the walls of which still remain in the garden of a private residence. In 1844 a very handsome court house was erected; it is situated at the north end of the town, fronting to Main street, and is ornamental to that locality. The county bridewell, erected in 1836, is not large, but of sufficient magnitude and convenience for the necessary accommodation and classification of prisoners. The manufactures established here are tanned leather, brogues, or coarse shoes, and coarse hats. Distilling and malting are also carried on, the former very extensively, by Messrs. Gartlan and

Sons, who furnish employment to upwards of sixty persons. There are some good inns in the town, Mr. Cassidy's Hotel, and the Shirley Arms, both in Main street, are excellent commercial houses and posting establishments; at the last-named is the excise office. The government of the town is vested in the county and resident magistrates, who hold general sessions of the peace in June and December, and petty sessions every Friday.

The parish church is a neat stone edifice, with a tower (in which is a clock with iron dial), surmounted by a spire. It stands at the southern end of the town, and was erected in 1622, after the old church was burnt by the insurgents, as before noticed, at the joint expense of Dr. Robert Boyle, Bishop of Clogher, the Rev. Andrew Montgomery, then vicar of the parish, and William Barton, Esq.; the remains of the old church are still standing. The Roman Catholic chapel, a handsome structure, was built in 1783, at the cost of the Rev. Hugh O'Reilly, Roman Catholic Bishop of Clogher, and Dr. James Carolan, of this town. The benevolent institutions consist of a dispensary, opened to the sick poor in 1823; a fever hospital, erected by private subscription in 1842; and a union poor-house, opened for the reception of the necessitous in 1843. The educational establishments comprise a free grammar school, founded and endowed by Lord Weymouth, in 1711; a school under the national board of education, and a parochial one. The market days are Thursday and Saturday, the latter a good one for grain, and likewise for cattle from March till September. Fairs May 27th, July 10th, September 27th, November 9th, and December 10th; chiefly for cattle and most of them well-attended. The parish of Magheross contained, in 1841, 13,444 inhabitants, and the town of Carrickmacross 1,997 of that number.
