

COACHES AND CARS.

To DUBLIN, by the conveyances to Drogheda, thence by Rail.
To ARMAGH, a Coach (from Drogheda), calls at the Shirley Arms, every Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoon at two; goes through Castleblayney and Keady.
To DROGHEDA, the Royal Mail (from Londonderry), calls at John M'Keon's Coach Office, Main street, every night at five minutes before twelve—a Coach (from Armagh), calls at the Shirley Arms Hotel, every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday forenoon, at half-past eleven—and a Coach (from Omagh), every Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoon at half-past one.

To DROGHEDA, a Car, from Michael Smyth's Car Office, Main street, every morning at seven—and another, from the Commercial Hotel, every morning at six, to meet the Trains to Dublin; also through Ardee and Colton.
To DUNDALK, a Mail Car, from the Commercial Hotel, every afternoon at four; goes through Louth—a Car, from Peter Donohoe's, New st.—and one from Hugh Gonnely's, New st., every morning at eight.
To LONDONDERRY, the Royal Mail (from Drogheda), calls at John M'Keon's Coach Office, every night at twenty minutes before one; goes through Castleblayney, Monaghan, Aughnacloy, Omagh, Newtown Stewart & Strabane.

To OMAGH, a Coach (from Drogheda), calls at the Shirley Arms, every Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday afternoon at one; goes through Castleblayney, Monaghan, and Aughnacloy.

CASTLE-BLAYNEY AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

CASTLE-BLAYNEY is a market and post town, in the parish of Mucknoe, barony of Cremorne, county of Monaghan, 62 miles S. by W. from Dublin, 18 N. E. from Cootehill, the like distance S. W. from Dundalk 16½ S. from Armagh, 14 S. by E. from Monaghan, 11 S. from Carrickmacross, about the same distance S. W. from Newtown-Hamilton, and 7½ E. by S. from Ballybay; pleasantly situated on the road from Londonderry, in the centre of a well cultivated country. The town derives its name from the family of *Blayne*, and the castle, which was erected here by Sir Edward Blayne, in the reign of James I., who created him Baron Blayne, of Monaghan. The demesne of Lord Blayne, which adjoins the town, is thus noticed by Frazer—"It embraces the whole of the lovely Lough Mucknoe, its pretty islets and softly swelling boundaries; and the rich foliage which now mantles the latter adds much to the splendour of the scenery. The plantations also clothe many of the surrounding heights, and while they increase the beauty of Lord Blayne's residence, they add to the appearance and comfort of this respectable town. On one of the small islands, in the lake, are the ruins of an ancient fortress." The town itself is one of limited trade; Lord Blayne, towards the close of the last century, promoted the linen manufacture by the establishment of a market, and the encouragement he gave to his tenants to prosecute that branch of industry, and there are many persons in the surrounding districts to whom the loom still furnishes employment.
