DROMORE,

A MARKET town and parish, nominally a city and seat of a diocese, is locally in the barony of Lower Iveagh, county of Down, 84 miles N.W. from Dublin, 20 W.N.W. from Downpatrick, about 17 S. by W. from Belfast, 7 N.E. from Banbridge, and about 5 S.S.W. from Hillsborough; seated on the river Lagan, and on the road from Dublin to Belfast. The name *Dromore*, corrupted into *Dromore*, signifies the great back of a hill, and is significant of the town's position on the side of a rising ground. Commercially this town is of little importance, and ecclesiastically its dignity is much faded. Its see is said to have been founded in the sixth century; the records, however, in this particular are not to be relied upon. The diocese was long remarkable as the smallest unannexed one in Ireland, and it has lost even that distinction by the Church Temporalities Act uniting it to Down and Connor, as noticed in the account of Downpatrick. The town, or city, for in fact it is properly entitled to the latter appellation, distinction, consists of a square and a few streets, neither long nor wide, radiating from it; neither is the square spacious; the town is, nevertheless, partially agreeable, and is clean and well kept. Its staple trade is linen cloth, of which considerable quantities are brought for sale on the market and fair days. Over the market house, a neat building, erected on arches, is a large apartment, used for public meetings and occasional assemblies.

The cathedral, or parish church, is a comparatively small and unpretending structure, not cruciform, and derives most of its peculiar interest from having been built by the celebrated Jeremy Taylor, and containing his remains, as well as those of other bishops of the see. The episcopal residence, adjoining the town, was built in the time of Bishop Bernard; and the woods around it planted by Bishop Percy, on the model, as it is said, of 'Leasowes,' the seat of Stenstone. It is now the property of Henry Baylee, Esq., and is a truly delightful residence, commanding, from its elevated situation, some fine views of the surrounding country. The other places of worship in Dromore are a Roman Catholic chapel, three Presbyterian meeting-houses, the same number of Methodist chapels, and one for Covenanters. In the parish are schools, free for children of the poor, a dispensary, and a loan fund. In the fourteenth century Sir Robert Bellinap and Sir John Holt, two corrupt judges, who gave an opinion that Richard II. was *above the law*, and who, in consequence, incurred the penalty of high treason, had their sentence of death commuted into banishment to 'the village of Dromore in Ireland.' The market is held on Saturday. Fairs the first Saturday in March, May 12th, July 20th, August 1st, October 10th, and December 12th, chiefly for cattle, pigs, &c. The parish of Dromore contained, by the returns made in 1841, 14,954 inhabitants, and the town 2,110 of that number.
