LOWTHERSTOWN.

OR IRVINESTOWN (by which latter name it is still
known) is a small market town, in the parish of Derry-
vullen, barony of Lurg, county of Fermanagh, 112 miles
N.W. by N. from Dublin, 6 S. by E. from Kesh, 9 1/2 N.
from Enniskillen, and 8 1/2 from Pettigo; lying on the
road between the two last named towns, near the right
bank of Lough Erne. The town, the situation of which
is secluded, consists principally of one street, at the
extremity of which stand the ruins of the old church,
and at a short distance from them the new one. The
place is undistinguished by manufactures of any kind,
and its trade is confined to the shops. Petty sessions
are held every alternate Wednesday; and there is a
constabulary police station in the town. In the vicinity
is Necarne, the seat of William D'Arcy, Esq., where
a small neat handsome castle was recently erected

The parish church of Derryvullen is a handsome
structure, in the Gothic style of architecture, with a
square tower: it was erected in 1831, at an expense of
£2,300., of which £1,385. was granted as a loan by the
late Board of First Fruits. At the opposite extremity
of the street to that in which the church stands, are
two Methodist chapels, and a short distance from the
town is a neat one for Roman Catholics. A school,
under the national board, a dispensary, and a union
poor-house, are the charitable establishments. The
Lowtherstown union, of which this town is the seat,
ranks as the 116th, was declared in September, 1840,
and the house possesses accommodation for four hun-
dred recipients. The market is held on Wednesday,
and the fairs on the 8th of every month. The town
contains 1,388 inhabitants.
