## MAGHERAFELT.

A FLOURISHING and respectable market town, and a parish, in the barony of Loughisholt, county of Londonderry, is 114 miles N. by W. from Dublin, 39 N.W. by W. from Londonderry, 25 W.N.W. from Belfast, the same distance N. from Armagh, 29 S. from Coleraine, 10 N.E. by N. from Cookstown, 6 W. from Toms Bridge, 4½ N.N.E. from Moneymore, the same distance N.W. from Ballyronan (on Lough Neagh), and between 2 and 3 S.W. from Castle-Dawson; situated on the road from Coleraine to Armagh. It is a well-built town, consisting of a spacious square, from which four principal streets radiate at the angles, and from these diverge smaller streets in various directions. Most of the houses are built of stone, and roofed with slate—altogether the town has a pleasant and improving appearance. In the centre of the square stands the market-house, a handsome building of stone: the upper part contains apartments for transacting public business, and a ball-room. At the lower end of the town is the court-house, a convenient edifice, with a small bridewell attached. The town is the property of the Salters' Company of London, leased to the Marquess of Londonderry and Sir Robert Bateson, Bart. The linen manufacture employs a large proportion of the inhabitants; one of the principal establishments, that of Messrs. Walker and Sons, is said to furnish employment to nearly a thousand weavers at their own houses. Bleaching, distilling, brewing, maling, tanning, and the general grain business, are branches extensively carried on, and, in the retail drapery, and a few other trades, there are

several well-stored shops. The Belfast Banking Company, and the Northern Banking Company, have each a branch in the town. General sessions of the peace are held in the court-house in June and December, as are petty sessions on alternate Wednesdays; and a manorial court is held monthly by the seneschal of the Salters' Company, for the recovery of debts under 40s. This town is a station of one of the four districts into which the constabulary force of the county are distributed.

The parish church is a neat edifice, built in 1654, enlarged in 1718, and a tower and spire added in 1790, and it has more recently been repaired. The Presbyterians have a meeting-house and the Wesleyan Methodists a chapel in the town; and a short distance from it the Roman Catholics have a place of worship. The charities comprise a dispensary and a union workhouse, and several schools for gratuitous education of both sexes—among these is Rainey's endowed school, and apprenticeship fund. The principal and general market is held on Thursday, and that for wheat and oats on Wednesday. The butter and linen market is held in Market-square; the pork and potato market in Charity-street; the flax market in Broad-street; and the wheat and oat market in Moneymore pass. On the second Thursday in every month is a large linen market; and extensive cattle markets or fairs are also held monthly. The annual fairs are August 25th, Oct. 29th, and Dec. 29th. The parish of Magherafelt contained, in 1841, 7,649 inhabitants, and the town 1,560 of that number.
