

PETTIGOE,

A SMALL market town, is partly in the parish of Drumkeeran, barony of Larg, county of Fermanagh, but chiefly in the parish of Templecarne, barony of Tírugh, county of Donegal, 121 miles N.W. from Dublin, 20 S.W. from Enniskillen, 11 S.W. from Lowerstown, 18 S.W. from Donegal, rather more than the same distance N.E. from Ballyshannon, and 51 S.W. from Kesh; seated on a small stream that divides the counties of Fermanagh and Donegal, about a mile north of the nearest part of Lower Lough Erne. Its vicinage is romantic and picturesque, and from the more elevated lands a fine panoramic view is obtained.

**POST OFFICE,** Thomas Read, *Post Master*.—Letters from all parts arrive (by mail car from ENNISKILLEN) every forenoon at a quarter before twelve, and are despatched at twenty minutes past twelve.

PORTADOWN,

A MARKET town, partly in the parish of Segoe, barony of Oneilland East, but chiefly in the parish of Drumree, barony of Oneilland West, county of Armagh, is 84 miles S. from Dublin, 26 S.W. by W. from Belfast, 19 W.S.W. from Lisburn, 15 E. from Dungannon, 10 N.E. by E. from Armagh, the same distance E. by S. from Charlemont, 9 S. from Lough Neagh, 6 E. by N. from Loughall, 5 S.W. from Lurgan, the same distance N.E. from Rich-hill, and 4 S.W. by N. from Gilford; elegantly situated on the river Bann, over which is a stone bridge of seven arches, connecting it with the small suburb of Edenderry, in the parish of Segoe. The Newry canal joins the river about a mile above the town, and the latter falls into Lough Neagh at its southern side, and, issuing at the opposite point, loses itself in the sea below Coleraine, thus forming, in connection with the canal, a water communication between that place and Newry. This town is also a principal station on the Ulster railway, which it is intended to extend to Armagh. The ancient name of this place was *Port-ne-doon*, signifying the 'port of the fortified eminence' from a castle of the M'Caun's, who occupied this important station, commanding the pass of the river Bann. In the reign of Charles I. Portadown consisted of no more than three or four small houses, and was granted by that monarch, with the estate, to J. P. Obyns, Esq. It now consists of a well-built principal street, and several smaller streets branching from it in various directions. In 1780 a general grain market was established by the late Major Obyns and George Woodhouse, Esq., and of late years the weekly sales of corn have greatly increased. The trade in other agricultural produce, and in pork and cattle, is also great.
