**STRANORLAR AND BALLYBOFEY.**

STRANORLAR is a market town and a parish in the barony of Raphoe, county of Donegal, 128 and 142 miles respectively, by different routes, N. N. W. from Dublin, 28 S. W. from Londonderry, 18 N. N. E. from Donegal, 16½ E. S. E. from Finntown, 14 W. by S. from Strabane, 1½ S. from Letterkenny, and 7½ W. from Castlefium. Situated at the intersection of the roads leading respectively to Donegal on the south, Londonderry and Lifford on the north east, and to the Western coast; and on the river Finn, over which is a stone bridge of three arches. The stupendous mountains of Barnesmoor, remarkable for their perpendicular ascent, and for their beautifully varied rocks and herbage, form the Gap of the same name—through this chasm a fine stream flows into Lough Esk, and it is also the pass between the north and west of Ireland coastwise, and on the main road to Donegal. Adjoining the town, which consists principally of one irregularly built street, are Drumbo Castle and demesne, the seat of Sir Edmund Samuel Hayes, Bart. The castle is a fine stately building, and the estate, which is well wooded, is a cheerful feature to the surrounding country, which is of a somewhat bleak character. The manufacture of linen, and the bleaching business is carried on in this locality—in the latter branch, on the opposite side of the river, are the extensive works of Messrs. J. & J. Johnston, which furnish employment to many of the industrious class. There is no other prominent trade establishment, if we may except the 'Queen's Arms Hotel,' a very excellently conducted house. The Marquess of Conyngham is proprietor of the town; courts for the manor are held in the Court-house monthly,

before the seneschal, and the magistrates assemble in petty sessions on alternate Wednesdays.

The parish church, a neat but ancient building, with a square tower, is situated at the eastern entrance of the town. The Roman Catholics have a convenient chapel, the Presbyterians two meeting-houses, and the Wesleyan Methodists one. The charities comprise several public schools, a dispensary, and a union poor-house. The market, which was accustomed to be held here on Saturday, has been transferred to Ballybofey (which see). Fairs, March 29th, June 11th, July 6th, August 12th, October 10th, and December 10th. The parish contained in 1841, 6,161 inhabitants, and the town 385 of that number.

BALLYBOFEY, variously spelt Ballibophay and Ballybofey, is a market town in the parish of Stranorlar, about half a mile west from that town. It is composed of one principal street, and though quite distinct from Stranorlar, and popularly regarded as subordinate to it, is virtually the seat of the principal trade for both Stranorlar and itself, and the place where the markets are held. There are, however, neither a place of worship nor post-office, Stranorlar being the nearest town for both. The tanning trade is carried on rather extensively here, but the main business of the town consists in supplying the inhabitants of the surrounding district with the articles of ordinary consumption. The market is held on Thursday, and the fairs on the Thursday before Easter and the 21st of May; likewise on the last Thursdays in the other months of the year. The market and fairs are tolerably well-attended—the latter for cattle, &c. The town contained, in 1841, 782 inhabitants.
