### DELIVERY OF LETTERS, &c.

The First or general and penny post delivery commences at eight in the morning, and comprises letters from LONDON, BANGOR, BATU, BELFAST, BIRKENHEAD, BIRMINGHAM, BRISTOL, CHESTER, CORK, EDINBURGH, ENNISKILLEN, GALWAY, GLASGOW, HOLYHEAD, LIMERICK, LIVERPOOL, LONDONDERRY, MANCHESTER, PORTPATRICK, SLIGO, WATERFORD, and WEXFORD.

The Second delivery commences at twelve noon, with letters from BLACKROCK, BOOSTERSTOWN, DALKEY, DUNDREUM, KINGSTOWN, RATHFARNHAM, and other suburban offices, as well as those deposited in the several receiving houses up to eleven o'clock forenoon, and the general post-office at noon.

The Third delivery commences at two in the afternoon, with letters from CLONTARF, DRUMCONDRA, FINGLASS, GLASNEVIN, and RAHENY, and those deposited in the receiving houses up to one afternoon, and at the general post-office to a quarter before 2.

The Fourth delivery commences at six in the evening, with letters from BELFAST and KILKENNY, also those from the suburban country penny post-offices, and from the receiving houses through the city, up to half-past five afternoon, and the general post-office to six in the evening.

The Fifth commences at eight in the evening, and includes letters from LONDON, BATH, BIRKENHEAD, BIRMINGHAM, BRISTOL, CHESTER, EDINBURGH, GLASGOW, LIVERPOOL and MANCHESTER, but should they remain due at that hour, they are not sent out for delivery till the following morning.

### Posting Letters.

Letters to be delivered in the city must be deposited in the receiving houses one hour previously, namely, before ten over night, eleven in the forenoon, and at one, three and five afternoon; but letters may be posted at the general office one hour later.

General post letters deposited in the several receiving houses up to half-past five afternoon, will be in sufficient time to be forwarded the same evening, but not later whether pre-paid or not.

Closing of the Box.—After the General Letter Box is closed in the evening, Irish letters are received to 7 o'clock for 1d. each, to half-past for three-pence each, and to a quarter before eight for 6d. in addition to the postage. Letters for England are received from five to half-past for one penny each, and to a quarter before six for six-pence each and the postage.
