

THE PAID LETTER OFFICE

Is open to the public from eight in the morning to eight in the evening, for all descriptions of Letters, including those for foreign parts, which are despatched from hence every day, either to LONDON, SOUTHAMPTON or LIVERPOOL, as the case may be. Ship Letters are also received in this office, and forwarded according to the routes specified on their respective addresses, to ports or places within the United Kingdom, as well as to foreign countries.

MONEY ORDER OFFICE

Is open from ten in the morning to three in the afternoon. The commission chargeable for Money Orders on sums not exceeding two pounds, is threepence; and not exceeding five pounds, sixpence, above which sum no order can be obtained.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

All letters, whether containing coin or not, can be registered at any post-office on payment of the registration fee of one shilling, in addition to the ordinary rates of postage, which must also be pre-paid.

NEWSPAPERS, PRICES CURRENT, &c.

Stamped British and Irish Newspapers pass free from one place to another. When addressed to a person residing within the delivery of the post town where posted, one penny is charged on a paper. British and Colonial Newspapers pass free to and from the Colonies by her Majesty's packets; the privilege includes papers to and from the East Indies by the Mediterranean packets. When the conveyance is by private ship, the postage is one penny. Foreign Newspapers received in Great Britain, and British Newspapers sent to Foreign Countries, are liable to a postage of twopence, unless there be a reciprocity treaty with the foreign post-office, when they pass free. The exemption, however, is only total in the case of post-office conveyances. Newspapers to France are forwarded free to the sender, but a rate of one halfpenny will be charged on delivery in France: when the papers are sent by private ship, they pay a postage of one penny. Newspapers to the East Indies are forwarded free via Southampton, but by the packet via Marseilles, on payment of threepence with each. All newspapers to be put into the office within seven days after the date of publication.

Price Currents and Commercial Lists, published in the United Kingdom, if duly stamped and under the weight of two ounces, will be treated as newspapers, and enjoy the newspaper privileges, the sanction of the postmaster-general having been previously obtained. Printed Prices Current and Commercial Lists from the British Colonies, France and China, are now admitted into the United Kingdom at the reduced rate of one penny each, whether conveyed by packet or private ship; from any other country twopence each.

(1) These mails are forwarded, by steam vessels, from SOUTHAMPTON to GIBRALTAR, every Thursday morning.
 (2) These mails are despatched from LONDON on the third of each month, and on the Thursday morning nearest the 15th of the month, and are conveyed, from GIBRALTAR to MALTA, by Her Majesty's steam packets employed in the Mediterranean.
 (3) These mails are forwarded direct from SOUTHAMPTON.
 (4) From August to January inclusive, the BRAZIL Packet touches at FERNAMBURGO and BAHIA on her outward passage to RIO JANEIRO, and the other six months on her homeward passage.
 (5) These mails are despatched on the 3rd and 15th of every month except in January, February, March, and December, in those months on the 5th only.

BRITISH AND FOREIGN MODE OF CHARGING LETTERS.

The British charge increases *two rates of postage* for every additional ounce, according to the scale of weight for charging inland letters, and the Foreign charge increases *one rate of postage* for every additional quarter of an ounce. It must be observed, however, that the English and French modes of charging by weight are dissimilar: a letter not being liable to an increased British rate, unless it exceed the half ounce or ounce, while an additional Foreign rate is charged if it actually attain the quarter, half, three quarters of an ounce, or ounce respectively.

The Overcharged Letter Office is open from ten in the morning to four in the afternoon.
