BALBRIGGAN AND SKERRIES.

BALBRIGGAN is a market and post town, sea-port and chapelry, in the parish and barony of Balrothey, county of Dublin, twenty-one miles north by east from Dublin by railway, and about eight south from Drogheda, situated on the line of railway passing between those two places, and on the eastern coast. Besides the advantage derived from its maritime position, the town possesses several factories, which employ a great number of hands. There are three for the manufacture of cotton yarn, and fastians, jeans, and some other cotton goods, and the same number for the fabrication of hosiery, and many females are employed in tambour work. The pier, which is nearly six hundred feet in length, forms a sheltered little harbour for shipping, at the termination of which is a light-house. Quarter sessions are held here, and petty sessions the second Tuesday in the month.

The church or chapel of St. George is a neat ereciform structure, with a lofty spire; and there is a noble Catholic chapel; besides which there is a neat Methodist chapel. There is a small market on Saturday, and fairs April 29th and September 29th. The population, in 1841, was 2,959.

SKERRIES is a sea-port and market town, in the parish of Holmpatrick, in the same barony and county as Balbriggan, three miles from that town; situated on a neck of land on the eastern coast, and is a station on the Dublin and Drogheda railway. It is of considerable importance as a fishing port, and previously to the withdrawing of the fishery bounties the trade of the place in this branch was much more considerable. At present about sixty vessels, averaging fifty tons each, are employed. The harbour is the best on this part of the coast, and is capable of being greatly improved. The roadstead is good, and safe in southerly winds, and the pier, which had become damaged by storm and decay, was repaired by the late Hans Hamilton, Esq. at considerable expense; but it is in contemplation to add another pier, which will be a great improvement. The strand, which is about a mile and a half in length, is not surpassed, in its adaption for sea bathing, on the coast. Under the head of manufactures, that of tannery work must be mentioned as prevailing extensively, furnishing employment to a large number of industrious people, the work of whose hands is in great demand, and sent to all parts of Ireland.

The church is a plain neat structure, to which a square embattled tower, surmounted by pinnacles, was added in 1819, by the great patron of the place, Hans Hamilton, Esq. before mentioned; the living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of his successor, James Hans Hamilton, Esq. one of the members for the county of Dublin. The Roman Catholic chapel, erected in 1823, is a spacious and handsome edifice. A parochial school house was built by J. H. Hamilton, Esq. and there is a national school. About a mile from Skerries is Hacketstown House, and its beautiful demesne, which skirts the bold and rocky shore. It was here that the late Marquess Wellesley resided, for two summers, while his lieutenant of Ireland. To the left is Milverton, the seat of George Woods, Esq. beautifully situated and commanding extensive views. On the Holmpatrick estate are quarries furnishing the finest stone, large quantities of which are shipped to Wicklow, Wales, and other parts, while much has been used in constructing the bridges on the line of the Dublin and Drogheda railway which runs through the estate. There are many delightful situations in the neighbourhood of Skerries, peculiarly eligible for building, and well worth the attention of the capitalist. The views are truly magnificent, and combine a pleasing variety of hill and dale, home scenery of vivid beauty, and sea views expansive and interesting. Off the coast are the islands called the SKERRIES, within which is a broad beach of sand, dry at low water. The islands are four in number, the largest to the south is called Shenick's Island; on it stands a martello tower; the others are the Red Island, the Colt Island, and St. Patrick's Island. The market is held on Saturday, and the fairs April 28th and August 10th. The population, in 1841, was 2,417.
