## BLESSINGTON.

Is a small market town and parish, in the barony of  
Talbot's-town, county of Wicklow, 17 miles s.w. from  
Dublin, 28 n.w. from Wicklow, and 7½ s.e. from Naas;  
situated near the banks of the Liffey, which romanti-  
cally winds through some very beautiful scenery, while  
the neighbourhood is much frequented by sportsmen  
in quest of the fine game it produces. Blessington was  
formerly a parliamentary borough, and the residence of  
Archbishop Boyle, and to this munificent prelate the  
place is indebted for the chief consequence it enjoys.  
He erected the church and tower, a neat stone build-  
ing, and furnished it with a good ring of bells, and a  
service of plate. Within the walls is a marble monu-  
ment, erected to his memory. The ruins of his resi-  
dence, which was burnt by the insurgents in 1798, are  
all to be seen. The estate are now in the possession  
of the Marquess of Downshire. The late marquess,  
who contributed so much to the improvement of the  
town, met a sudden death, in its vicinity, in the spring  
of 1845, falling lifeless from his horse immediately after  
quitting the town with his agent. The charitable in-  
stitutions are the Marquess of Downshire's schools, a  
Sunday school, and a dispensary; the latter a small  
but neat stone building. The Roman Catholic  
chapel, situated about a mile from the town, is a  
small but commodious structure. In a room over the  
market house (erected by the late marquess) petty  
sessions are held every alternate Tuesday. The market  
is held on Friday, and fairs May 12th, July 5th, and  
November 12th. Population, in 1841, 466.
