

house, good buildings; the former in Palace-street, the latter in Laurence-street. There are several interesting remains of ecclesiastical buildings, which, though we can only thus briefly allude to, must, nevertheless, possess considerable interest with the antiquary. A convent, in Fair-street, dispenses the benefits of education by means of a public school for girls, and there are two other convents respectively situated in Laurence-street and Laurence-gate.

The several markets here are abundantly supplied—they are, for corn, &c. in Fair-street; for meat, in West-street; for vegetables, Bolton-street; for cattle, Wellington-quay; and for fish, on the New-quay. Fairs are held March 11th, April 12th, May 12th, June 22d, August 28th, October 29th, and December 20th. In 1841, the population of Saint Peter's parish was 13,910, and that of Saint Mary's 5,070; total 18,980, which has since increased, as it is estimated, to 20,000 or more.

COLLON is a respectable and rather extensive village, in the parish of its name, which is partly in the barony of Upper Slane, county of Meath, but chiefly in the barony of Ferrard, county of Louth, about six miles N.W. from Drogheda. It is one of the neatest villages in Ireland, and owes the greater part of its attractions to the taste and liberality of the late Lord Oriel, who built the main street after his own designs, and at his

own expense. There are some extensive oatmeal mills, and works for bleaching linen; and four miles and a half from Drogheda is COLLON BRO, the extensive nursery grounds of Mr. Michael Faulkner. The church, a handsome structure, consists of three parallel aisles, surmounted by as many spires. Collon is the principal station of the Louth Staff Militia. Fairs are held June 3rd and November 24th. The population, in 1841, was 936.

JULIANSTOWN is a village and parish, in Lower Duleek barony, county of Meath, situated about four miles and a half south-east from Drogheda, on the road to Balbriggan. The places of worship are the parish church, erected in 1770, and three Roman Catholic chapels in different parts of the parish. Population of the village about 150.

TERMONFECKIN or *Termonfechan*, is a village and parish, in the barony of Ferrard, county of Louth, about four miles and a half N. by E. from Drogheda; situated half a mile from the sea shore. The place is of very remote antiquity, and the village was formerly a town of considerable importance; it is, at the present day, resorted to, in the summer season, as a pleasant sea village. The parish church and a Roman Catholic chapel are the places of worship. Population of the village about 400.
