COACHES.

To DUBLIN, the Royal Mail (from Wexford), calls at the Post-Office, Temple Shannon, every afternoon, twenty minutes before three; goes through Gorey, Arklow and Rathfriland.

To DUBLIN, the Defiance Coach, calls at the Coach Office, Market square, every morning at half-past seven; goes through Newtown, Mount Kennedy and Bray--and the Rivals calls at the Bridge-foot same time; goes the same route.

To NEW ROSS, a Car, from Blaneconia Office, every morning at half-past eight; and a Mail Car, from the Post-Office, twenty minutes before twelve noon.

To WEXFORD, the Royal Mail (from Dublin) calls at the Post-Office, Temple Shannon, every morning twenty minutes before six.

To WEXFORD, the Defiance Coach (from Dublin), calls at the Coach Office, Market square, every afternoon at four--the Rivals calls at the Bridge-foot at the same hour--a Mail Car, from the Post-office, every morning at eight; and a Car, from Cooper's, Market square, every morning at same hour, and afternoon at two.

FRANKFORD AND BALLYBOY.

FRANKFORD is a small market town, in the parish and barony of Ballyboy, King's county, 75 miles v. by s. from Dublin, and 11 miles from Banagher, Blirr, and Tullamore, seated on the Silver river, on the road between the two last named towns. It is a neat little place, consisting of one main street and two smaller ones. A distillery and two corn mills, in Frankford, and a flour mill, in Ballyboy, are the chief trading establishments.

The places of worship are the church, and a neat Roman Catholic chapel; the former erected in 1815, is situated at the village of BALLYBOY, about a mile from Frankford. Contiguous to the church is a free parochial school for boys and girls, founded by Mr. Henry

Price, and conducted on the Lancasterian system, and there is a national school. In the town are a dispensary, and an asylum for six aged widows. A large estate, once belonging to a friary of Carmelites, has passed into the possession of the family of Magawley, one of whom, Count Magawley Cerrati, held a high post under Napoleon's widow, Marie Louise, Duchess of Parma; the family mansion is called Temora. The market is held on Saturday. Fairs, in Frankford, April 28th, May 28th, September 23rd, November 8th; in Ballyboy, May 4th, August 21st, and December 6th. Population of Ballyboy parish, in 1811, 3,060, of Frankford Town 1,345 of that number; and of Ballyboy village 348.
