

court-house (in which sessions are held twice a year and petty sessions weekly), the fever hospital and dispensary, the school-rooms above named and the London and Dublin Bank, are all handsome buildings. The stranger will not let an antique stone cross in the centre of the town escape his notice; it was raised from its prostrate position, it is said, by Dean Swift; it is richly sculptured, but the inscription and figures are much effaced by time and neglect. It is extremely aged, and the new corporation purpose removing it to a fitter place, and to encircle it with an iron rail fence. A little beyond the church is a singular looking dwelling place, with a stone roof, from which spring not merely ivy and other creepers, but shrubs and trees; it is said to be the cell wherein St. Colum Kill dwelt; that it is extremely old is manifest; the lower part is tenanted. The Kells poor-law union ranks as the 53rd, was declared in July, 1839, and the workhouse contracted for in February, 1840; it contains accommodation for six hundred persons.

The parish church is a handsome structure, and was rebuilt, except the spire, in 1811. The interior is fitted up with considerable elegance, and furnished with a

fine toned organ; the church and its steeple are detached; the latter is admired for its symmetrical proportions. In the church-yard stands one of those lofty round towers, in fine preservation, the origin and object of which have so long perplexed antiquaries. The Catholic chapel is a handsome building, with a pinnacled tower; the altar is enriched with a valuable painting, by Guido, of the Ascension, presented by the Marquess of Headfort. Adjoining this chapel are the schools, founded by the late Miss Catherine Dempsey, the erection of which cost £7,000.; the female school is conducted by the 'Sisters of Mercy,' and the boys by the 'Christian Brothers;' the national board of education contribute towards the support of these schools. The parochial school is ably conducted under the British plan, to which Hullah's system of music is superadded; Archdeacon Stopford is a main supporter of this school. There is a third public school, for females, maintained by the Marquess of Headfort. A good market is held on Saturday for corn, cattle, pigs, &c. Fairs February 23d, May 24th, July 16th, September 9th, October 16th, and November 17th. The population of the town, as taken in 1841, was 4,205.

KILBEGGAN AND BALLINAGORE.

KILBEGGAN is a small market town and parish, in the barony of Moycashel, county of Westmeath, 56 miles W. from Dublin, 19 E. from Athlone, 10 E. from Moate-Grenogue, and 6 N. from Tullamore; situated on the banks of the small river Brosna, near the southern extremity of the county, and it has the benefit of a branch of the Grand Canal from Dublin, which is brought within half a mile of the town. It was formerly a borough town, and sent two members to the Irish parliament. Its chief municipal officer now is a portrieve. Petty sessions are held in the court-house every alternate Saturday. Manufactures are unknown here, but during the butter season considerable business is done in that article; and there are several extensive corn and flour mills and a distillery. The flour mills of Mr. D. W. Delany, at Coola, and those of Mr. J. Locke, are upon a large scale.

The church, which is seated near the river, is a neat stone building, with a square tower; a chapel for

Roman Catholics, and one for Wesleyan Methodists, are the other places of worship. A dispensary, supported by subscription and the usual county grant, a loan fund, and a national school, in which one hundred and fifty children receive instruction, are the chief public institutions. The market is held on Saturday, and the fairs January 6th, March 25th, June 16th, August 15th, September 25th, and October 28th. Population of the town, in 1841, 1,910.

BALLINAGORE is a beautiful hamlet, in the parish of Newtown, in the same barony as Kilbeggan, about two miles and a half north from that town, elegantly situated on the banks of the river Brosna, and may be said to owe its importance to the extensive flour and meal mills of Messrs. William and John Perry, which are capable of manufacturing 50,000 barrels of flour and meal annually. A chapel for Wesleyan Methodists and a barrack or the county constabulary are in the village. Population, in 1841, 125.
