## LONGFORD,

THE capital of the county of its name, is a market and post town (formerly a parliamentary borough), in the parish of Temple-Michael, partly in the barony of Longford, but chiefly in that of Ardagh, 74 miles S.W. from Dublin, 15 W. from Granard, 12 S. from Ballymahon, and 9 N. from Edgeworthstown, pleasantly situated in a valley on the high road to Sligo and the western counties, and about four miles from the Shannon. The town, which is watered by the small river Camlin and the Royal Canal, consists of two main streets, and other smaller ones diverging; at the end of the principal one, which is wide, are the cavalry barracks. The public buildings and establishments, exclusive of those devoted to the purpose of divine worship, are a county gaol, a county infirmary, barracks for the military and civil powers, a court house, a union work-house, excise and stamp offices, the market buildings, a subscription news-room, and public schools. The county gaol was completed in 1825, at a cost of about £14,000; it is a convenient building, adapted to the classification of prisoners, and constructed on the radiating principle. The court-house, which stands in the main street, is a spacious building; in it are held the county assizes twice a year, sessions four times in the same period, and petty sessions weekly on Monday. The Longford poor-law union was declared in May, 1839, and the work-house was contracted for in January, 1840, and completed in March, 1842. Longford was incorporated and made a borough by charter of Charles II, which was abrogated by the 9th of George IV, and the government of the town vested in twenty-one town commissioners elected by the rate-payers. The corporation sent two members to the Irish parliament, but were disfranchised by the legislative union. The members at present sitting for the county of Longford are Colonel Henry White and Anthony Lefroy, Esq. The town confers the title of baron on the Pakenham family. The town of Longford has improved since the exten-

sion of a branch of the Royal Canal to the town; its local business is doubtless promoted by its thoroughfare situation and still more by the well-attended markets. In corn, bacon, and butter, considerable business is done; and in brewing and distilling there is a large establishment for each branch; the brewery is justly celebrated for its excellent ale and porter. A branch of the 'Bank of Ireland' and one of the 'National Bank of Ireland' are in operation here; and there are two good hotels—the 'Longford Hotel,' in Main-street, combines the posting business, with unexceptionable accommodation for families and commercial gentlemen. Contiguous to the town, on the banks of the canal, are the beautiful and extensive nursery grounds of Mr. William Ferrall. The 'Longford Journal,' a talented and well-supported weekly newspaper, is published on Saturday; and a news-room, amply supplied with the leading London, Dublin, and provincial journals, is well-attended by subscribers.

The parish church is a neat edifice, in the Grecian style of architecture, with a spire. The Roman Catholic chapel is a very handsome structure, with a spacious portico formed of six noble Ionic columns, and a tower, nearly two hundred feet in height; the other places of worship are for Presbyterians, and Primitive and Wesleyan Methodists. There is also in course of erection a Roman Catholic cathedral, which it is considered will, when completed, be the largest and most elegant structure of the kind in Ireland. The public schools are one each, on Erasmus Smith's foundation and the national board. On the site of ground, at present occupied as barracks, stood the castle of Longford, and near to it an extensive abbey, of which few if any traces now remain. The markets are held on Wednesday and Saturday, the latter, which is the principal, is an extensive one for corn, butter, pigs, and linen. Fairs March 25th, June 10th, August 19th, and October 22nd. The population of the town, in 1841, was 4,966.
