TRIM, SUMMERHILL AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

TRIM is a market and assize town and parish, the latter partly in the barony of Upper Navan, but chiefly in that of Lower Moyferiah, county of Meath, 27 miles N.W. from Dublin, 11 S.W. from Navan, 7½ S. from Kells, and the like distance S.E. from Athboy. This, the county town of Meath, and one of great antiquity, is situated on the river Boyne, and embellished by beautiful scenery. It was formerly a place of great strength and consequence, the seat of the Irish parliament so late as 1465. In 1469 the mint was here. It was constituted a borough and corporation in the thirteenth century, and sent members to parliament until the Union. This ancient town, associated with the De Lacys, the Mortimers, and the Talbots of former days, and of the Wellesleys of modern times, is surrounded by vestiges of old castles, monasteries, and priories. The most conspicuous are the remains of Trim Castle, consisting of a triangular-walled inclosure, with circular flanked towers, and a large and lofty keep in the centre. The circumference of the wall is four hundred and eighty-six yards. On the other side of the river is a lofty fragment of St. Mary's Abbey, called the 'Yellow Tower,' opposite to which is 'Talbot Castle,' in which the Duke of Wellington received a portion of his education: the Talbot arms will be noticed in the north wall of the west tower. This castle was most probably built by the famous Sir John Talbot, afterwards Earl of Shrewsbury; it is now occupied by the Rev. James Hamilton. The ruins of a priory of Augustinian canons, dedicated to Saint Peter and Saint Paul, attract the eye of the antiquary, as he passes near Newtownmills on the Dublin road—a highly impressive remnant of days gone by. The assizes are held twice annually—in the months of March and July, and petty sessions every second Saturday. The court-house is a handsome building, and the county gaol combines the appearance of complete security with architectural elegance. The centre, which contains the governor's apartments and the chapel, is circular, with a dome and lantern, which radiate the cells of the prisoners. Near the gaol are the fever hospital and the union

workhouse, both ornamental buildings. The view from the door of the gaol and the hospital, embracing the river Boyne and the ruins of the castle and abbey, are strikingly picturesque. A handsome column of the Corinthian order stands in a commanding situation, erected by the county, in 1817, to the honour of the Duke of Wellington—a statue of whom surmounts the capital. The duke was born at Dangan, four miles from this spot, and in Trim his early education commenced. There are several extensive corn mills in the town and neighbourhood, most of them on the banks of the Boyne, and there are two excellently-conducted hotels; that of Mr. Darling, in High-street, though of moderate charges, is upon an extensive and liberal scale, having a handsome commercial room and commodious stables; it is a posting-house, as is likewise Mr. Newman's, in Market-street.
 The parish church was rebuilt in 1802; but the ancient tower still remains, and looks strong enough to battle with the elements for as many more centuries as it has done already. The Catholic chapel is a tasteful and capacious erection, with a residence for the priest contiguous. The incorporated society of Dublin have a school here, wherein twenty day scholars and six boarders are educated, and nine acres of land are held by the society in Trim; there is also a national school. The market is held on Saturday. Fairs, March 27th, May 8th, June (moveable), October 1st, and November 16th. The population of the town, in 1841, was 2,269.
 SUMMERHILL is a charming little village, in the parish of Laracor, about 6 miles S.E. from Trim, in the same county as that town. The village forms a square, in the centre of which is a green, environed by fine trees. It is the property of Lord Langford, whose beautiful domain adjoins the village. Dangan Castle, now in ruins, the birth-place of the Duke of Wellington, is about two miles north of Summerhill. The places of worship are a Roman Catholic chapel, and one for Presbyterians. Fairs, April 30th, June 9th, September 22nd, and November 25th. The population of the village is under 300.
